RE: Monthly Summary Narrative Report for June 2011

Let me begin by apologizing for the tardiness of this report. Back on June 29/30 we suffered a catastrophic failure of our main server when an air conditioner failed and the server room temperature rose to a level that caused the server to overheat and fail. As a result, most of our data was lost, at least temporarily. Thanks to the hard work of the IT department, they have been able to slowly recover the data for us. The total assessment is yet to be determined but in conversation with David Knox, the cost in diverted wages, time and hardware, will probably exceed \$40,000. That is not to mention the loss of time we experience daily trying to locate files etc that have drifted into cyber-space. Thankfully, we did not lose the E911 system, but we came close. Bottom line is we are all working together to gather our info with the hope of finding the lost files. I would like to publically thank the IT Department for their diligence in helping us through this event.

June was a very trying month not only for the Town as a whole, but specifically for the members of our public safety community. Our officers responded to a medical aid whereby a 14 year old Galvin Middle School student passed away. By bringing in the STARS team from NEMLEC, and working with a number of outside counselors, we were able to manage the situation and work with the students, teachers, Police and Fire personnel who were dispatched to the scene. It was a very taxing event for all concerned.

Calls For Service-Our calls for domestic violence are steadily on the rise. Our personnel are responding to more calls and calls that are much more violent in nature. Just this month alone, our officers responded to a call whereby a 15 year old resident was assaulting his grandmother. This is just one example of how things are changing. Recognizing the need for more proactive domestic violence prevention, I have again joined the Board of Directors for the Wakefield Alliance Against Violence. Additionally, we are partnering in a joint grant application with Respond, Inc and the Malden Police Department in an attempt to develop crisis teams to respond to incidents of domestic violence using a unified approach.

Wakefield made the news when a State Police Helicopter was forced to make an emergency landing at Nasella Field after the pilot observed a red warning light in the cockpit. Emergency crews stood by while a mechanic checked the aircraft for any anomalies. The ship was deemed safe to fly and left later that day.

Once again, narcotics have played a role in our business. Both our patrol officers as well as detectives assigned to drug control made arrests for distribution of heroin, oxycontin, cocaine and other opiates. The interesting trend is that the arrestees in these cases were from New Bedford, Lawrence and one from Bronx NY. These cases are far from over!

Officers also responded to a Parker Road address for a fatal drug overdose. This was the second fatal at the same address in a month.

Community/Neighborhood Policing-Four of our officers received training in a program called “Voices”. This program, sponsored by Eliot Services helps officers in their dealings with schizophrenic patients. Our goal is to use a “train the trainer” model to have these officers help train the remainder of the officers in the department. We have partnered with WCAT to make the training film. Thank you goes to Tom Stapleton of WCAT for helping us with this program.

Both officers Kelly Tobyne and Amy Toothaker have received training in car seat installation and will work with Sgt Kevin McCaul in assisting young parents (and grandparents) in the proper and safe installation of the new car seats.

Personnel-We currently have two officers who are out of work with line of duty injuries. Detective Mike O’Connell is out with a foot injury and Ptl Dave Driscoll a shoulder injury. As an example of their dedication to the Town and the Department, both officers opted to return to work, light duty. Their spirit has helped me save overtime costs and helped us streamline operations in their specific areas of responsibility. I applaud both officers for their efforts.

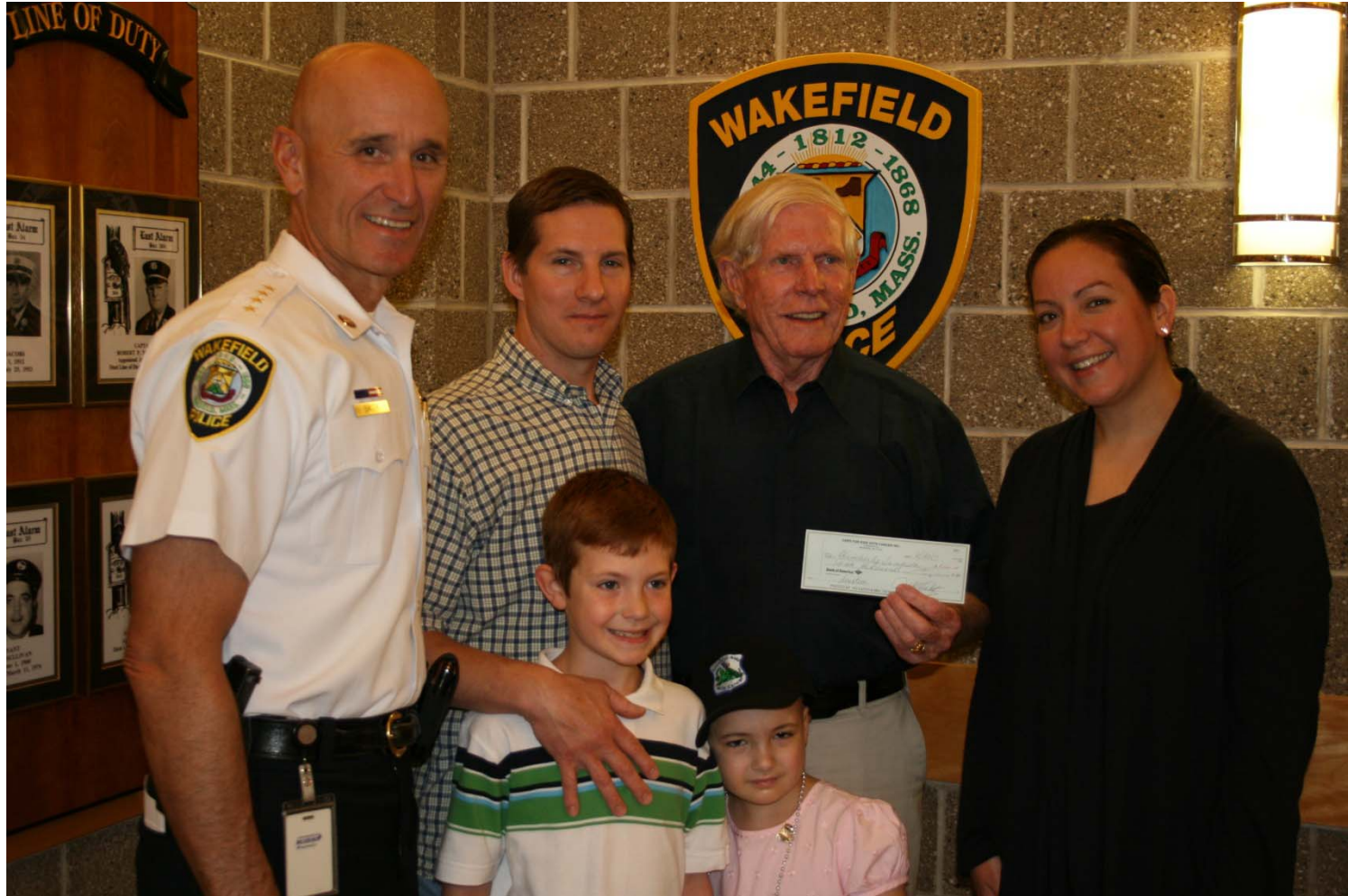

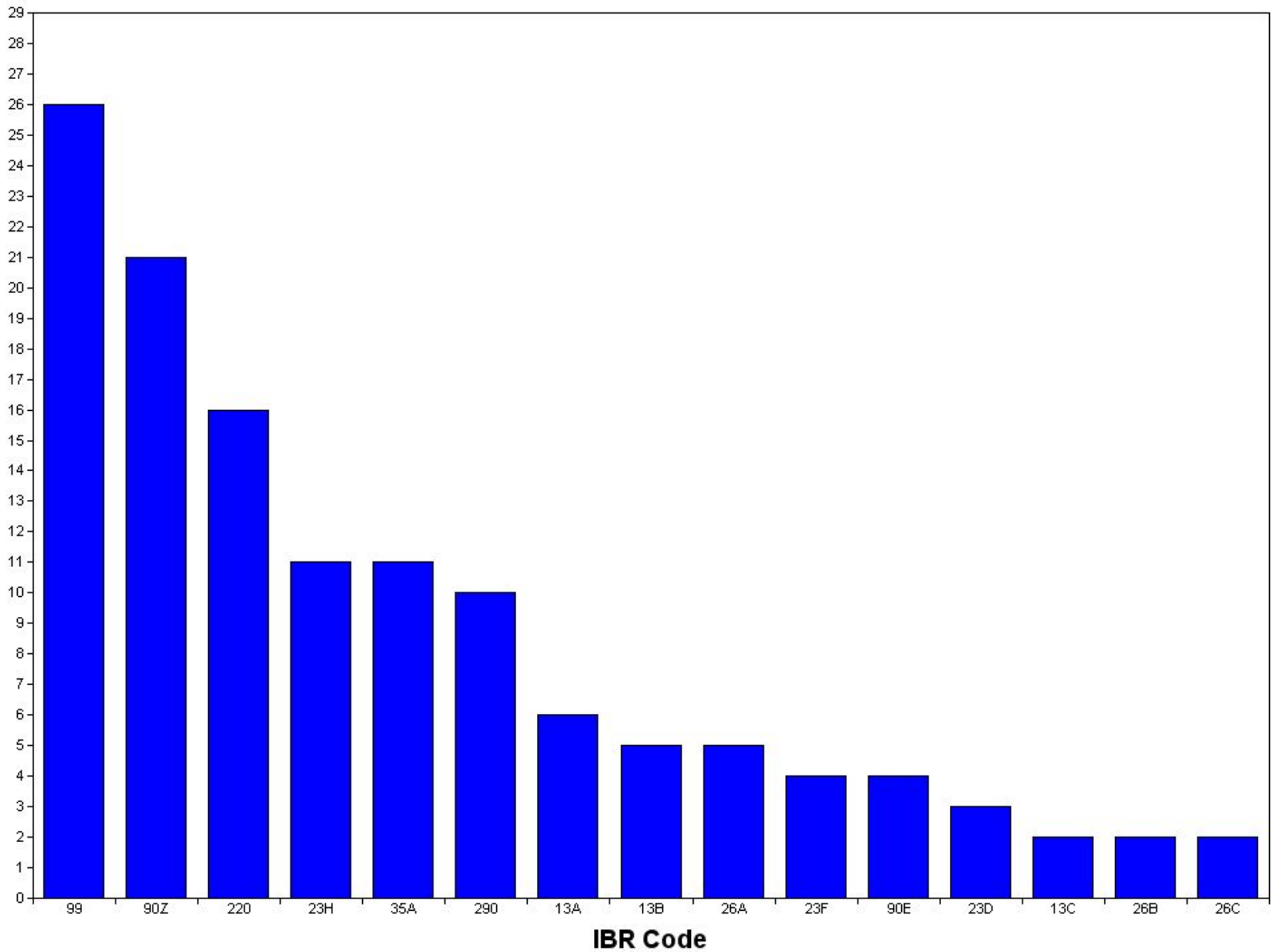

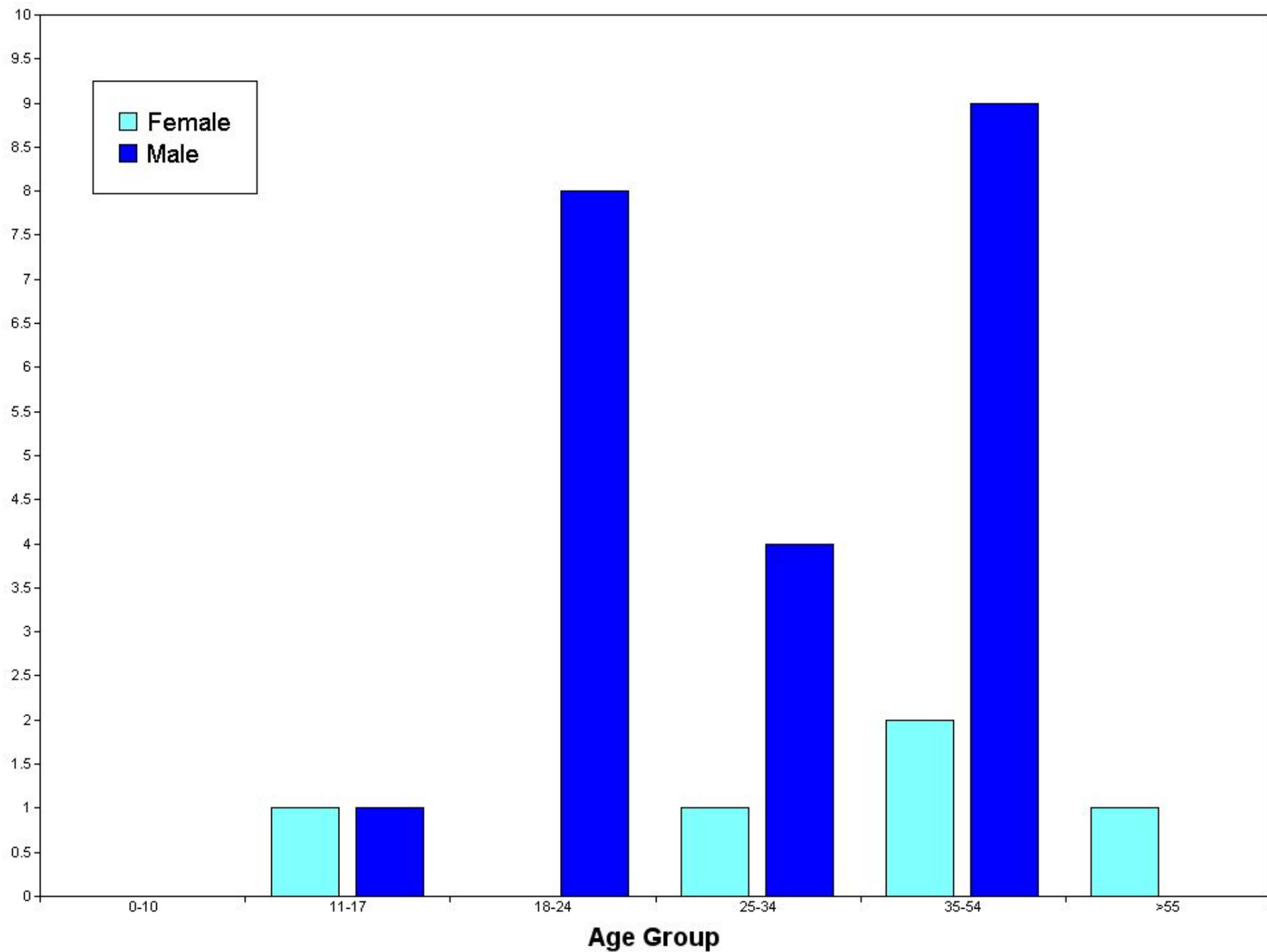

Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex



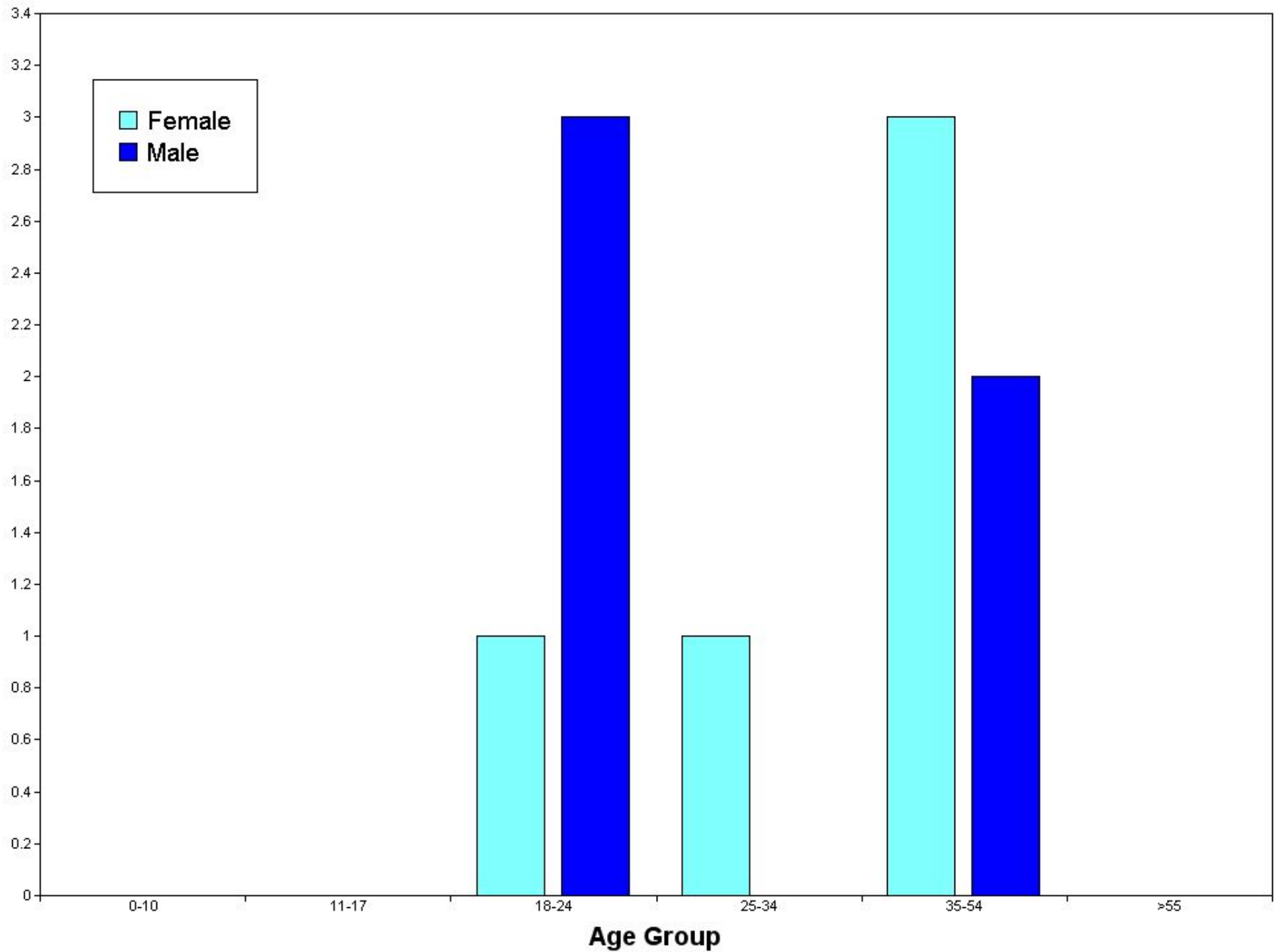

Summons Arrests By Age / Sex



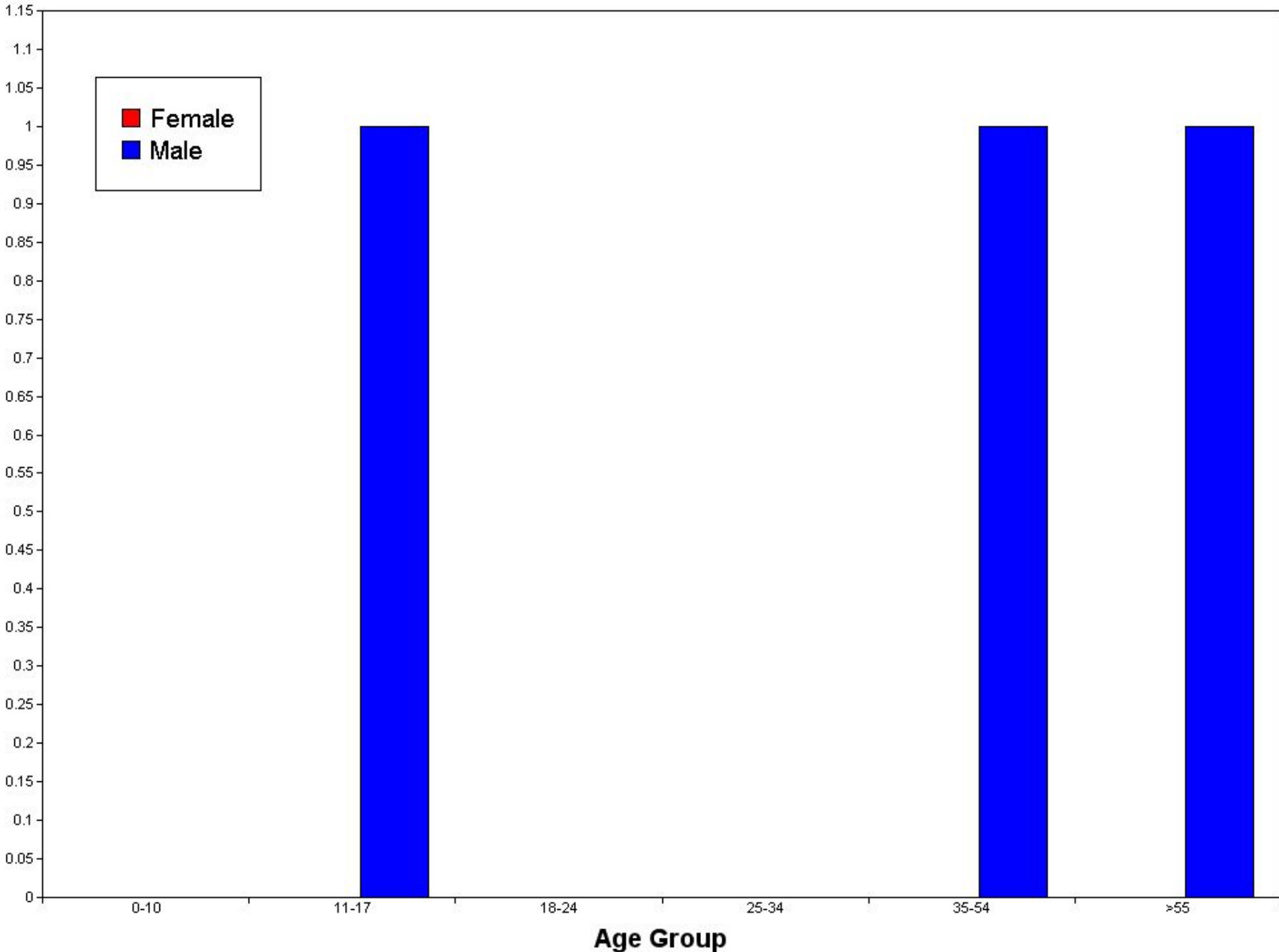

Protective Custody Arrests By Age / Sex





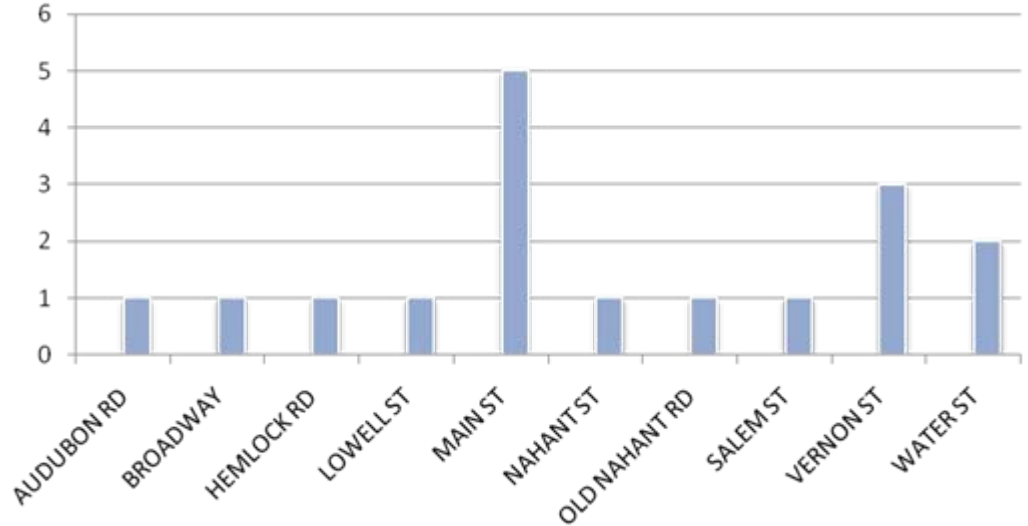
