  - General Construction almost complete
  - Busy Dog basement technologies did a free evaluation on 11/6 of basement water issues and
    working with engineers to develop a plan to remediate water issues. Pending report findings to
    determine options and next steps. Also looking to get some cost estimates. Likely need drain
    inside building on perimeter.
  - Bank Building next door ownership change ongoing conversations with Town Administrator on this. Don't know direction that the building will be going in. need more concrete plans to determine next steps including Chestnut Street access.
  - Front entrance ideas and option illustrations working with local contact to explore fresh/new ideas and contacts. Chris has provided some of his visualizations to get conversation started to be able to move forward with more concrete suggestions and estimates. Have some accessibility grant funding available.
  - Likely need to increase water capacity into building as we move forward- starting to work towards this with DPW.
  - ARPA funding for pandemic related needs
  - Chris has been working with local representatives and town managers to discuss these various financial needs. Conversations are ongoing.
  - Painting Rear room, back hallway and front upstairs hallway are in progress
  - 13 Additional Lights and 30 Bulbs arrived, being installed. Will increase lighting capacity
  - Chris updated Commission for disabilities issues on December 6<sup>th</sup> on our progress. Will continue to meet with them at least annually.
