Trash Reduction	R. Darnell and J. Smith-Galvin shared that town will now have a town preferred curb side compost vendor, Black Earth. To promote the program, 200 free starter kits are available. The town estimates that a family generates an average of 12 lbs per compost per week.
	With the new recycling contractor contract, a dumpster is being added at the pit for large cardboard collection. Bi-weekly curbside recycling will remain.
	The Town is looking to add \$20/bulk pick up charge, which helps town earn credits towards state grants.
Green Communities Act (GCA)	J. Smith-Galvin shared at Monday's Town Council meeting, she presented the Stretch Code, one of 5 requirements of GCA, and recommended that the TC submit the stretch code by-law to Town Meeting. The council will continue discussion of adding the Stretch Code at their March 22 nd meeting. J. Smith-Galvin plans to bring state DEP GCA advisor, R. Darnell, and building inspector to present and address questions.
