- 1) Public Participation: None
- 2) Motion to approve minutes of the minutes for the January 12, 2023 Full Finance Committee meeting by Dan Sherman Seconded by Bill Boodry and so voted.
- 3) Town Hall Budget Subcommittee Chair Evan Kenny presented an overview of the Town Hall Budgets presented. The Subcommittee is comfortable with all budgets presented.
- 4) Town Hall budgets were reviewed with the following noteworthy comments:
 - I) Treasurer's Budget:
 - a) The increase over the 2023 Budget was \$5407 due to contractual and negotiated increases.
 - II) Fire Alarm:
 - a. The increase over the 2023 Budget was \$3,811 due to the increase in the number of traffic equipment as well as the increase in the cost of supplies.
 - III) Emergency Management:
 - a) The increase over the 2023 was \$1676 due to contractual and negotiated increases.
 - IV) Inspectional Services
 - a) The Increase over the 2023 Budget was \$18,329 for contractual and negotiated increases as well as additional costs for new code informational material. It was noted that the department processes over 2500 permits a year and raises over \$700,000 in fees in a normal year however this fiscal year to date \$1,054,998 has been generated.

V) Recreation Department:

a) The increase over the 2023 Budget Was \$2990 for negotiated and contractual increases. It was noted that the department generates over \$500,000 per year in fees.

VI) Veterans Budget:

a) The decrease of 58,707 from FY 2023 is due to a declining trend in veterans benefits sought. We will continue to monitor this budget and will make sure that all veterans are serviced.
