

Wakefield Historical Commission April 26, 2022 Minutes of Meeting

- 1. The meeting was **called to order** by chair Nancy Bertrand at 7:02 p.m.
- 2. Dan Benjamin led the group in a **Pledge of Allegiance**
- 3. No public participation was offered.
- 4. The **minutes of the March meeting** were approved as submitted with a motion by Fran and second by Gene.
- 5. **Historic House markers** were discussed. Since a new permanent vendor has not been found an interim solution was discussed and approved by the Commissioners. Several promising possibilities were mentioned. A new permanent vendor is being sought.
- 6. Other matters.
 - a. The town's first survey for the new **Master Plan** is available to be taken before April 27th.
 - b. A lot of attention has been given to **113 Salem Street**, a National Register-listed building, constructed between 1840 and 1857. The house is called the David Nichols House. Nichols was a shoemaker. The house is for sale and generating much attention.
 - c. **Volunteers on the Commission** were sought to pay careful attention to the agendas of the Planning Board and Board of Appeals so that we can flag any possible conflicts with historic properties.
 - d. **Dan and Cathlina have been appointed** to three-year terms. Since new appointments have been made the Commission organized for the upcoming year. **Nancy Bertrand was elected as Chair** for the coming year. With no volunteers acting as secretary, she will also take the minutes.
