- 3. Administrative Actions
  - A. Meeting Minutes

The meeting minutes of the 08/02/22 Permanent Building Committee/School Building Committee Wakefield Memorial High School Project were presented for review.

Chip Tarbell made a motion to approve the Wakefield Memorial High School Meeting Minutes as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin. Motion was approved unanimously.

B. Invoices

Three (3) invoices in the total amount of \$215,041.42 for the Wakefield Memorial High School Project were presented for review and approval.

*Charles Tarbell made a motion to approve Leftfield LLC Invoice #15 dated 08/09/22 in the amount of \$22,000.00 for Basic Services as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin. On a roll call vote, the motion was approved unanimously.* 

Charles Tarbell made a motion to approve SMMA Invoice #57710 dated 8/09/22 in the amount of \$154,000.00 for Basic Services as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin. On a roll call vote, the motion was approved unanimously.

Charles Tarbell made a motion to approve SMMA Invoice #57710 dated 8/09/22 in the amount of \$39,041.42 for A&E Environmental & Site Consultants as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin. On a roll call vote, the motion was approved unanimously.

### C. <u>Review and Approval of Designer Contract Amendment No. 2</u>

Designer Contract Amendment No. 2 consists of the following additional services.

- Hydrant Flow Test (John Hoadley) \$2,225.00
- Added Geotechnical (LGCI) \$50,369.00

### Designer Contract Amendment No. 2 Total: - \$52,624.00

Requires a budget transfer to from the Other Contingency leaving a balance of \$309,480

CT inquired as to the reasons behind the need for additional borings on site. EP from SMMA stated that based on the results of test pits and soil borings already performed in the area of the new building, SMMA along with the project's Geotechnical Engineer after reviewing the results from previous investigatory work concluded that performing a geophysical survey and additional borings are highly recommended to better understand existing soil conditions in order to finalize the schematic design for foundations in order to be included in the schematic design estimate. This work would normally be performed in the next phase of design, but SMMA decided to bring it forward a phase in order to have a better understanding on cost and avoid cost increases given the volatility of the market at the moment.

CT continued by inquiring about schedule. EP stated that they were still finalizing schedule and would update the project's Leadership Group and the PBC at their next meetings. CT inquired if the School and Athletic Director have been notified. EP confirmed that they are in communication with School Leadership and they are aware that the field and track will not be able to be utilized for pre-season sports and other activities during the time when work is being performed.

Charles Tarbell made a motion to approve Designer Contract Amendment No. 2 in the amount of \$52,624.00 for a hydrant flow test and additional Geotechnical as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin. On a roll call vote, the motion was approved unanimously.

### D. Review and Approval of Budget Revision Request No. 4

LS continued and stated that approval of Budget Revision Request No. 4 is needed to fund Designer Contract Amendment No. 2. This a Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) budget requirement.

*Charles Tarbell made a motion to Budget Revision Request No.* 4<u>as presented. Seconded by Tom Galvin.</u> *On a roll call vote, the motion was approved unanimously.* 



### 4. <u>Budget Update</u>

LS reviewed the current Total Project Budget which is included in the presentation attached to the meeting minutes. The Project has committed 84% of the Feasibility Study Budget to date and has expended 58%.

### 5. <u>Construction Manager Update – Introduction of Bond Building Company</u>

David Capaldo began Bond's interview presentation by introducing Bond company profile and project teams for the Wakefield Memorial High School Project. Some Members of the Bond project team have previously worked with the Town of Wakefield on the Galvin and are also Wakefield residents. Bond reviewed the master project schedule for the project. Bond stated that will be proactive in incorporating long lead times for items/materials into the project schedule. Bond continued by presenting their phasing of the project to better align with current functions of the existing High School and to ease transitions to reduce any disruptions to students/faculty during construction. Bond's full presentation can be found attached to these minutes and is also available on the project website along with the meeting recording.

The CM Contract Package has been provided to Bond for signature. Bond will return signed copies to the town for execution of the contract. LeftField will then provide an executed copy to the MSBA. Bond's contract is currently only for Schematic Design Services and will be amended for the remaining phases of the project pending project approval.

### 6. Design Update

SMMA began reviewing current site plan overview for the new High School including the updated drop off area, which now includes learning stairs between the front entrance of the school and the relocated Beasley oval. SMMA reviewed the overall process for site plan development by demonstrating the many different design iterations that SMMA has considered for the project. The current site plan emphasizes open outdoor play spaces, open outdoor learning spaces, student drop off, and increasing existing parking on site. The plan includes expanded parking between the relocated Beasley oval and the Woodville School with realigned two-way site entrance and will be used as the primary entrance for service/delivery vehicles. Due to site constraint, the loading dock of the school has been relocated to the front, right side of the new school.

SMMA is currently looking how to incorporate the site's Grade Transitions into the design of outdoor play and learning spaces. SMMA also reviewed potential outdoor material under consideration for the site design with an emphasis on materials with natural coloring/texture, durable, and environmentally sustainable. SMMA reviewed the current design plans for the outdoor academic commons, the outdoor central commons, and play spaces for all age groups.

SMMA continued by presenting the results of their Student Transportation Survey. This information will assist SMMA in their continued design of the site. SMMA also passed this information over to the Wakefield Master Planning Committee. The key takeaway from the Survey is that current students are open to utilizing alternative modes of transportation (not using a car) in getting to/from school.

The current total parking count for the existing High School is 269. The parking plan for the new High School currently has around 275 parking spaces. SMMA is currently reviewing the possibility of expanding existing parking at Landrigan Field, however, this may be restricted by existing conservation land.

SMMA reviewed possible revisions to the Beasley Oval design based on feedback received from the School's Athletic Department regarding expanding the Track & Field program (eight lane track instead of six lane track) and adding additional spectator viewing along Farm Street. CT and JB stated that they did not believe that these changes have been adequately reviewed with the Project's Leadership Group and that there should not be any further discussion with the PBC until the Leadership Group has fully reviewed the proposed design. SMMA replied by stating that they included the potential redesign in tonight's presentation mainly to showcase that the proposed redesign may not be feasible given the limited site constraints. JB also stated that aesthetically, he was not in favor of including additional spectator seating along Farm Street because it would block the view of the School from Farm Street.

The Selection Subcommittee then ranked the CMs on their interviews based on how w addressed the outline of topics provided, focusing on the CM's Team, Prior Experience Approach to the Wakefield Memorial High School Project.

The Technical and Interview scores were entered into the Scoring Matrix which weight Proposals at 25% and the Interviews at 50%

The Price Proposals were then reviewed in comparison to each other. The Subcommit rank the Price Proposals in the order of lowest to highest based on the CM Fees which components that are non-negotiable

The Price Proposals scores were entered into the Scoring Matrix and weighted at 25%. After all scoring categories were totaled, the overall score resulted in Bond Building Company being the highest ranked Construction Management firm. The top two firm's scores were very close and were only separated by 2/10 of a point.

PR stated that he is currently working with Bond Building on the Public Safety Project and that the meetings are well organized, and they are a well-run company, so he looks forward to working with them on the High School Project.

Chip Tarbell made a motion to approve Bond Building as the Construction Management firm for the Wakefield Memorial High School Project. Seconded by Philip Renzi. Motion was approved unanimously.

JB, Chair of the PBC, will serve a liaison on behalf of the PBC during contract negotiations and contract execution with Bond Building. The contract with Bond Building will only be executed for preconstruction services through Schematic Design. Bond Buildings contract will be amended to include all other phases of pre-construction, construction, and project closeout once the project receives Local and MSBA Board of Director's approval.
