April 2020 Highlights

On April 1st, officers were dispatched to the area of Main Street and Richardson Street for a disturbance between two male parties who appeared intoxicated. Upon arrival, they observed both individuals and engaged them in conversation. While one of the involved remained calm, the other began screaming and swearing at the officers. He continued his tirade and then began to challenge the officers. He then began coughing at them and yelling that he had the coronavirus. As he continued to refuse verbal commands they were forced to use hands-on techniques to gain compliance. He was taken into custody for Disturbing the Peace and Disorderly Conduct. His out of control behavior continued throughout the booking process and he was eventually transported to Winchester Hospital for further evaluation.

On April 7th, officers were dispatched to an apartment on Water Street for a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival, they spoke with a female outside who advised that she had been in a heated verbal argument with her boyfriend that escalated into him using physical force against her. Officers then proceeded inside to locate the male subject. He immediately yelled that he was not going to jail and attempted to fight with the officers. After a brief struggle, they were able to secure him with handcuffs. He continued his belligerent behavior throughout the booking process, swearing and spitting at officers. As he was placed into the cellblock he threw one of his shoes that struck Officer O'Brien. He is facing multiple charges through Malden District Court.

On April 9th, officers were dispatched to the Lakeside Inn for a report of a male party in distress. Upon arrival, they were met by EMS staff who were attempting to transport this individual to the hospital for evaluation. During this time the individual was uncooperative and was trying to grab narcotics that were within his reaching area. He became increasingly agitated towards officers as they attempted to assist him out of the hotel and into the ambulance. He continued his tumultuous behavior as officers attempted to gain control and bring the incident to a peaceful resolution. After a struggle that continued with EMS staff, they were able to secure him on a stretcher for transport.

On April 11th, officers were dispatched to the Lakeside Inn for a report of a male party that was out of control and breaking windows and threatening individuals. They were able to locate the involved party on the second floor. He was agitated as they engaged him in conversation. Officers were able to calm this volatile situation and the individual was transported to the hospital for evaluation. Although our overall calls for service numbers are down, our high-risk calls have not slowed down as our officers bravely continue to work through the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Our clinician Jennifer Waczkowski has been working from the station during the pandemic. She continues to provide follow-up to individuals identified by officers or called in by friends/family members in need of additional support, be it for mental health, cognitive/elder concerns, dual diagnosis involving substance use, outreached to local community providers to obtain resources for those experiencing homelessness, and various other support functions. She has also been in contact with the directors of DMH contracted community-based programs as well as the area director for several of our group homes. Additionally, she has assisted at the Wakefield Food Pantry and worked with Mystic Valley Elder Services.

Our recovery coach Tracy Ascolillo has been working remotely and continues to follow-up on all substance use related cases via phone. She worked with Eliot specialists throughout April to assist those that are experiencing homelessness and with DMH for those that have mental co-occurring disorders. Tracey has assisted numerous people who were struggling to better connect with their telehealth therapy appointments. She has also been providing extensive outreach support to family members during these unprecedented times.

During April we spent much of our time trying to engage the public and especially our youth via social media and neighborhood visits. This included bedtime stories, a coloring contest, and cruiser birthday parades. We hope to return to some sense of normalcy in the near future and will continue to provide the best services that we can as we navigate through the challenges of the present.

April was National Autism Awareness Month. The purpose of this cause is to spread awareness, promote acceptance and to ignite change. In support of Autism Awareness, Wakefield Police Officers wore special patches on their uniforms for the month of April.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex








P.C. Arrests By Race, Sex and Age


