April 2021 Highlights

On April 5th, Officers Rob Haladay and Matt Warren were dispatched to the Lakeside Office Park for a report of an out-of-control male that was suffering some type of mental health crisis as well as damaging property. When Officers arrived, he was inside his mother's vehicle punching the windshield. Upon seeing the Officers, he immediately jumped out of the car and ran into one of the office buildings. Officers quickly caught up with this party and were able to use verbal techniques to de-escalate the individual's violent behavior. The individual was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation as well as injuries to his hands from punching the windshield. Our clinician Jennifer was also on scene and was able to speak with the male and provide additional supports for the mother.

On April 13th, several officers responded to a residence for a male party having a mental health crisis. The mother reported that her son was destroying the inside of the home. This included damage to a wooden door, a light fixture, and a wall. The officers were allowed into the home and began to engage the male party in conversation. The Officers, along with the clinician, were able to de-escalate the male party and he was transported to the hospital without incident for a mental health evaluation. On April 15th, a Melrose resident drove a lost elderly male to the Wakefield Police Station. The Melrose resident explained that he found the elderly male on his doorstep in Melrose and the gentleman knew that he lived in Wakefield but could not remember how to get back to his home. Family Services Officer Amy Rando spoke with the elder and was able to gain enough information to determine his identity. Officer Rando spoke with the elderly man's sister and was able to determine that he did reside in Wakefield with another sister. He was transported to the hospital to be checked out and then reunited with his family.

On April 21st, officers responded to a residence for a report of a domestic disturbance between a father and adult son. It was reported that one of the individuals was in possession of a knife during the conflict. The son is known to have mental health issues and at times can be violent. Officers were first met by the father who advised that the son was causing the disturbance. They then spoke with the son who was making paranoid and delusional statements. There was no further allegation of a knife with either party. The son was transported to the hospital without incident for a mental health evaluation. Further assistance was offered to the father by the Family Services Officer. Mental health clinician Jennifer will be following up on this case.

On April 21st, we partnered with the U. S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and participated in National Drug Take-Back Day. This is a biannual event that we host free for our residents where they can dispose of potentially dangerous expired, unwanted, or unused prescription drugs. On this date, we took in close to 100 pounds of prescription drugs for disposal. Sergeant Kevin McCaul and Officer Meaghan Roberto put a lot of work into this and we appreciate their efforts.











CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:








CRASH LOCATION MAP:
