August 2020 Highlights

On August 9th, Officer Mark O'Brien was traveling on North Avenue at approximately 9:15 p.m. when he observed a gray Infiniti traveling southbound with no headlights or tail lights illuminated. Other motorists were beeping and flashing their high beams to no avail. He was able to catch up to the vehicle in the area of Chestnut Street where he attempted to conduct a stop. The Infinity continued on North Avenue despite the blue lights and sirens. The vehicle eventually stopped in the middle lane at the intersection of Albion Street. As he interacted with the male operator, Officer O'Brien was able to detect an odor of alcohol and slurred speech. After a series of field sobriety tests, the male party was taken into custody and charged with Operating Under the Influence of Liquor.

On August 14th, Officers were dispatched to an apartment complex on Richardson Avenue for a reported disturbance. Upon arrival, they spoke with a witness who stated there had been a heated argument between two individuals in a hallway. A third individual attempted to quiet the situation down when one of the involved pulled out a large knife and threatened him. Officers interviewed the suspect and were able to locate the knife without further incident. The suspect was taken into custody and charged with Assault by Means of a Dangerous Weapon.

On August 22nd, Officer Shane Pelletier was patrolling Vernon Street near Salem Street when he observed a white Nissan proceed through the intersection without slowing or stopping for the stop sign. He then conducted a traffic stop in the area of White Circle. While the operator was attempting to retrieve the registration from the glove box, Officer Pelletier observed a box fall to the floor which was marked" Federal Ammunition 40 grain" which contained live ammunition. Officer Pelletier immediately called for additional units and retrieved the box. The resulting investigation found a male passenger to be in possession of a spring-loaded double-edged knife. Also located in the vehicle was a Glock replica BB gun. Multiple illegal drugs were discovered during the investigation. Both male parties are facing charges out of Malden District Court.

On August 23rd, the Town of Wakefield was hit by one of the worst storms in recent memory. At approximately 5:30pm, heavy rain and wind caused widespread damage throughout the entire town. For several hours our Officers responded from one emergency call to another, many involving fires, fallen trees and downed power lines. All Officers performed at an extremely high level, including those managing an overwhelmed dispatch center to those out on patrol attempting to create safe spaces for other town departments to complete necessary work. This was a team effort both internally and externally and we were proud to be part of this very successful large scale operation that resulted in no reported injuries.

On August 26th, Officers responded to Albion Street for a report of a male party behind a building walking back and forth in an agitated state while holding a firearm. The individual was described as wearing shorts with no shirt. Upon arrival, officers were directed to a beige building behind a business. As they approached, their attention was drawn to a male in a second-story window. They were able to communicate with this individual who stated that he was in possession of a BB gun. One officer was able to go up a back stairwell while other officers monitored the male in the window. They were able to order him to keep his hands up and eventually secure him for safety while they continued with the investigation. The subject was acting in a paranoid and delusional manner as he attempted to answer questions. He was eventually transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation without incident. This potentially life-threatening call was handled in the most professional manner by our Officers without any use of force. This is a testament to their level of training and skill level.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex









CRASH LOCATIONS AUGUST 2020




LOCATION CRASH OCCURRED
