January 2020 Highlights

On January 7, we received a report in regard to a domestic situation where a female with an active restraining order against her exboyfriend was being harassed and threatened. After further investigation, it was determined that there was probable cause to arrest the male party. Officers Matthew Warren and John Whaley responded to an address on Valley Street to locate the suspect. They spoke with him and advised that he was going to be placed under arrest. The suspect tried to close the door on the officers as they attempted to take him into custody. They began wrestling with him in a small hallway as he continued to fight. After a struggle, they were able to gain control and place him into custody without further incident.

On January 8, we received a report during the early morning hours from a Grafton Street resident of two suspicious male parties walking around in a backyard. They were described as wearing dark clothing and holding backpacks. It was reported that these two were

observed attempting to break into a motor vehicle. We then received another report that they were now on Ames Street. Shortly thereafter there was another report of the male parties running through a driveway in that area. Officers began a search and a short while later Officer Carman located one of the males hiding behind a deck on Middle Street. This individual was taken into custody. Later that day, Wakefield Detectives were in Malden working with the Malden Police Department and were able to locate and take into custody the second male party. Additionally, they are working to tie these two individuals along with a third male party into several business breaks in Wakefield and other surrounding cities and towns.

On January 14, we received a report during the morning of a larceny of a Nissan Rogue that had just occurred in the area of Town News on North Avenue. Officer Whalen and Detective Silva responded to the area and began looking through some of the security systems of local businesses. The vehicle had been left unoccupied and running. The suspect was described as a large male party with a beard wearing a red sweater and black pants. They were soon able to obtain the identity of this individual and broadcast this out to area departments. This vehicle was spotted in Melrose, however, the operator was able to evade police after they attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle was later found abandoned in the City of Malden. Later that day Officer Whalen and Detective Silva were able to locate the suspect on Avon Street where he was taken into custody.

On January 22, we received information from the Woburn Police Department that a male party from Wakefield was wanted for an armed robbery that occurred earlier in their city. Wakefield units were advised to be on the lookout for this individual. Later that evening, Detective Ryan was able to locate the vehicle of the suspect on Andrews Road. Multiple units responded and set up a perimeter. After further surveillance, the individual was later taken into custody without incident.

On January 29, Officer Carman was on patrol during the early morning hours when he entered the parking garage at the Everly Apartment complex located at 14 Audubon Road. This complex has had numerous motor vehicle breaks in recent past, and he entered to ensure that there was no suspicious activity. As he made his way up the ramp he observed a black Lincoln Navigator running with its lights shining at an Audi A4, which was also running. A registry check showed the registered owner of the Navigator as a resident of Chelsea. As he turned around, both vehicles left the area. He then observed a male party standing in the area and pointing in a frantic type movement in the direction of the Lincoln. He pulled up to the male party who advised him that about a week prior, the operator of the Lincoln had pulled a gun on him after an argument. Officer Carman continued heading in the same direction. He was able to catch up to the Lincoln as he entered the Market Street Rotary and conducted a stop. Additional units from our Department and Lynnfield PD arrived on scene. After further investigation, a loaded 9mm handgun was located in the center console.

Additionally, a bag with approximately 370 grams of heroin was located in the vehicle. The subject is facing weapons and drug trafficking charges.

We would like to congratulate Officer Matthew Warren for receiving the most recent "Officer of the Quarter" award. Officer Warren is a member of our patrol division and has been with our department since 2007. On November 1 a theft was reported by a Wakefield business where a male suspect took the cash drawer from an unattended register and fled on foot. During November Officer Warren developed a suspect based on the physical description and other factors. His attention to detail coupled with familiarity with local individuals played a key role in recovering evidence that eventually led to criminal charges. Officer Warren consistently performs at a high level and we appreciate all of his efforts.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex








P.C. Arrests By Race, Sex and Age



Crash Locations January 2020


