## **January 2022 Highlights**

On January 3rd, a concerned mother reported her adult son was walking on the train tracks while in a mental health crisis. Units quickly began to canvas the area looking for the individual in question. Shortly thereafter, officers located the male on Tuttle Street. Officers were able to establish a good dialogue with the individual while awaiting the arrival of his mother. Care and custody was transferred to the mother without incident and the male was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.

On January 6th, we received paperwork for a male party staying at the Lakeside Inn Hotel ordering him to a mental health evaluation. Prior to this, we had received information this individual had the potential to be violent. Officers and our clinician Jennifer responded to the hotel and were able to locate the subject in one of the guest rooms. They were able to establish a positive rapport and after a short while he exited the room. The male was transported to the hospital without incident.


On January 7th, dispatch received a call from a father reporting that his adult son was depressed and suicidal. Officers immediately responded to the residence and spoke with the reporting party, who received these messages via phone and was unable to make entry to the son's home as the doors were locked. As additional information was gathered it was determined that a forced entry would be required. Officers were able to

enter through a window with assistance from the Fire Department. They began a search and soon observed a trail of blood to the kitchen area. Suddenly, the male in question appeared from a pantry closet bleeding heavily from a substantial wound to his arm. Medical aid was rendered and the subject was transported by ambulance to the hospital without further incident.

On January 10th, officers were dispatched to McDonalds restaurant for an intoxicated female attempting to operate a vehicle. Upon arrival, Officers spoke with the manager who advised the vehicle in question was now in the drive-thru lane. Officers approached the vehicle on foot and attempted to speak with the operator. The operator refused to communicate with officers and ignored verbal commands as the vehicle slowly moved forward. The vehicle then accelerated through the drive-thru lane and exited the parking lot heading north on Main Street. A short time later, Sergeant Matt Powers observed the vehicle on North Avenue being operated erratically. He attempted a traffic stop, however the vehicle failed to pull over and headed onto route 128 North. The pursuit was terminated at this time and notifications were made to surrounding cities and towns and the State Police. After exiting the highway, Sergeant Powers observed the vehicle on Vernon Street pulling into a driveway. The vehicle continued to the end of a long driveway as Sergeant Powers pulled in maintaining a safe distance. He then observed the vehicle backing toward his cruiser. He was unable to get out of the way and the subject vehicle crashed into the front of the police car. Fortunately, this resulted in no injuries to either Sgt Powers or the vehicle operator. The female operator was taken into custody for operating under the influence of alcohol and other motor vehicle violations.

In January, we were able to add Officers Jeanette DeMasi and Shawn Conway to our team of car seat technicians. They now join Sergeant Kevin McCaul and Officers Amy Rando and Kelley Tobyne in assisting parents and grandparents install car seats to the proper specifications. Additionally, the group gives out seats free of charge along with installation whenever grant funding is available. This continues to be one of our most popular programs at the WPD and something that this group takes a tremendous amount of pride in. We are pleased to have these two dedicated officers added to the staff.

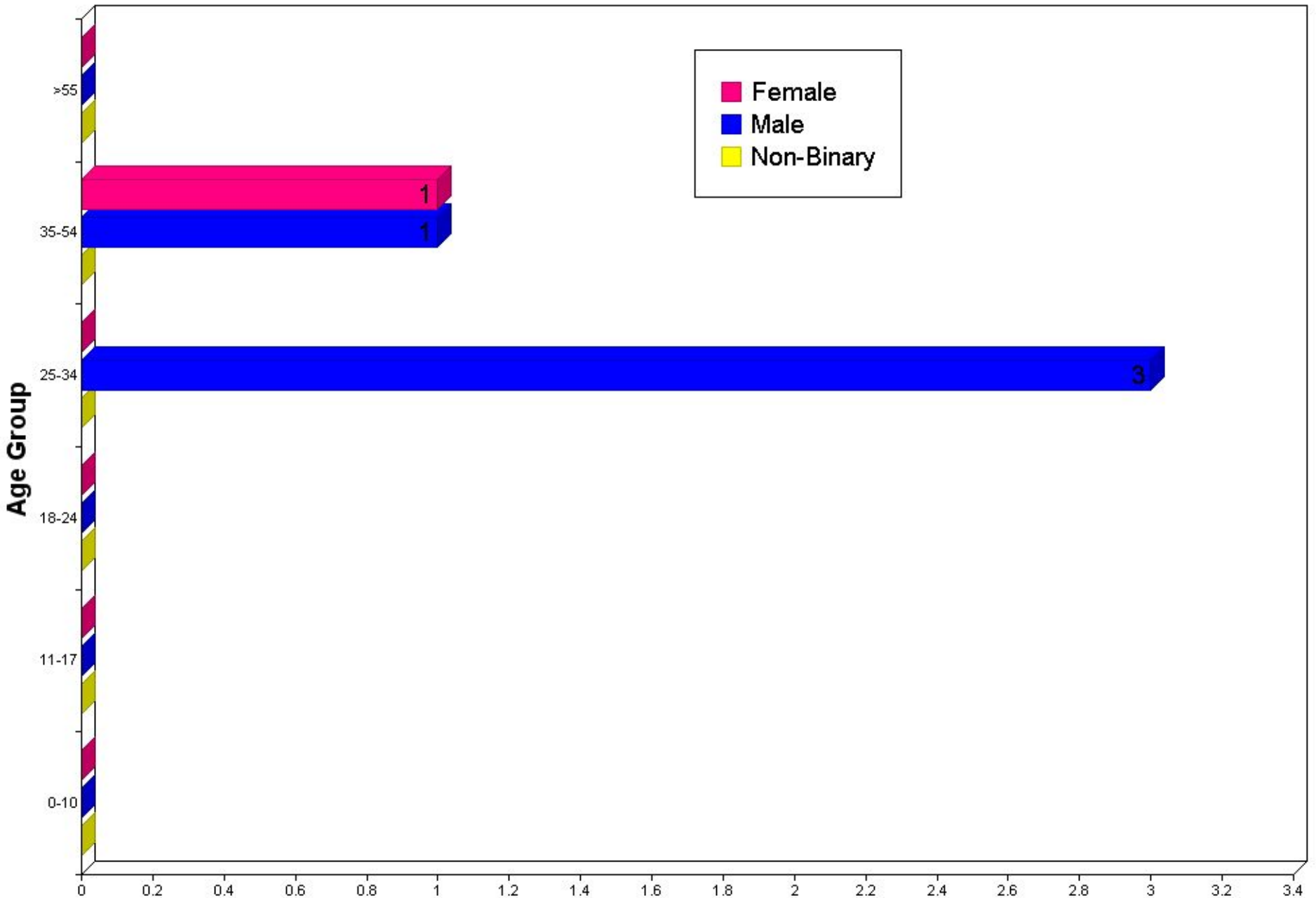

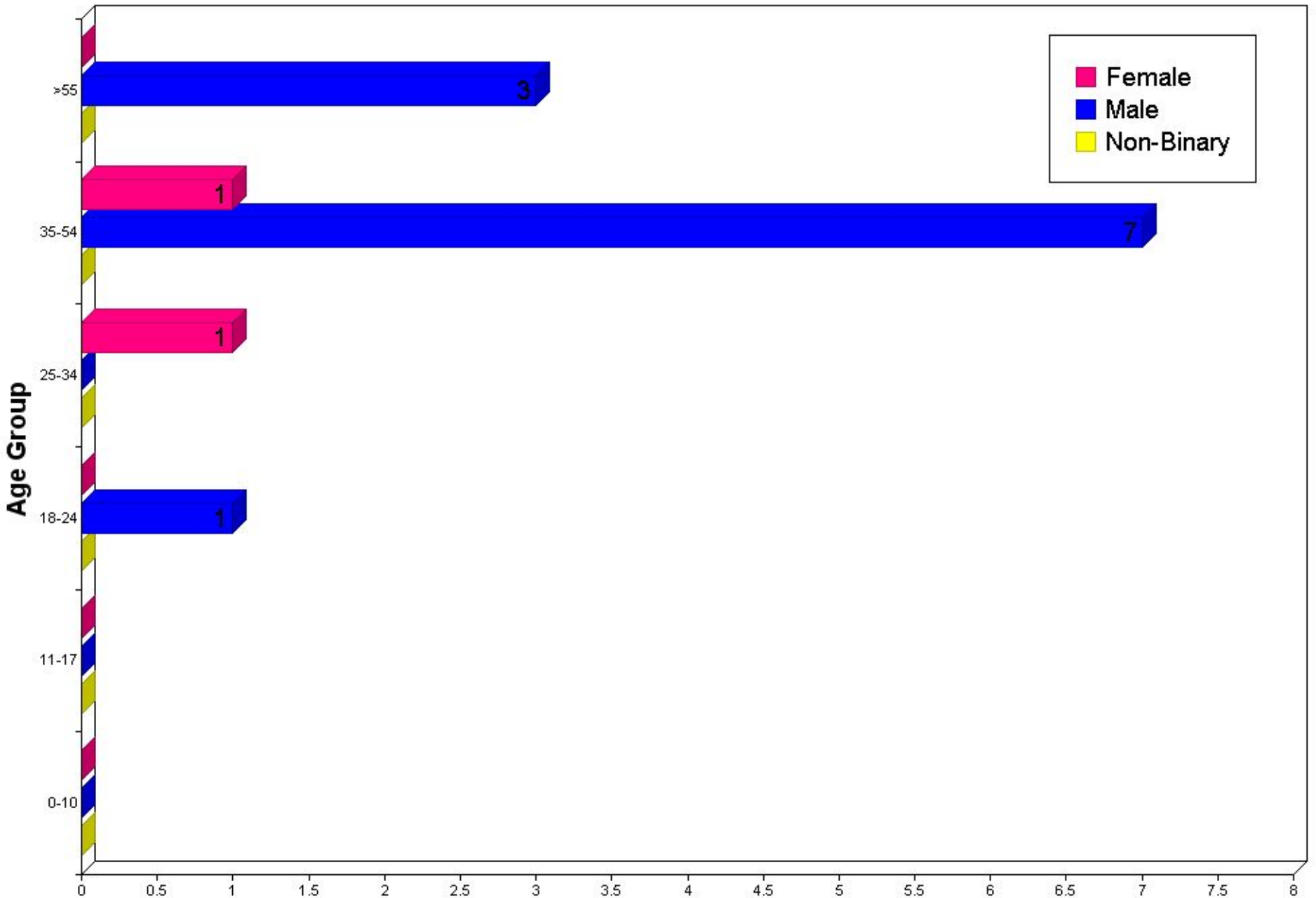

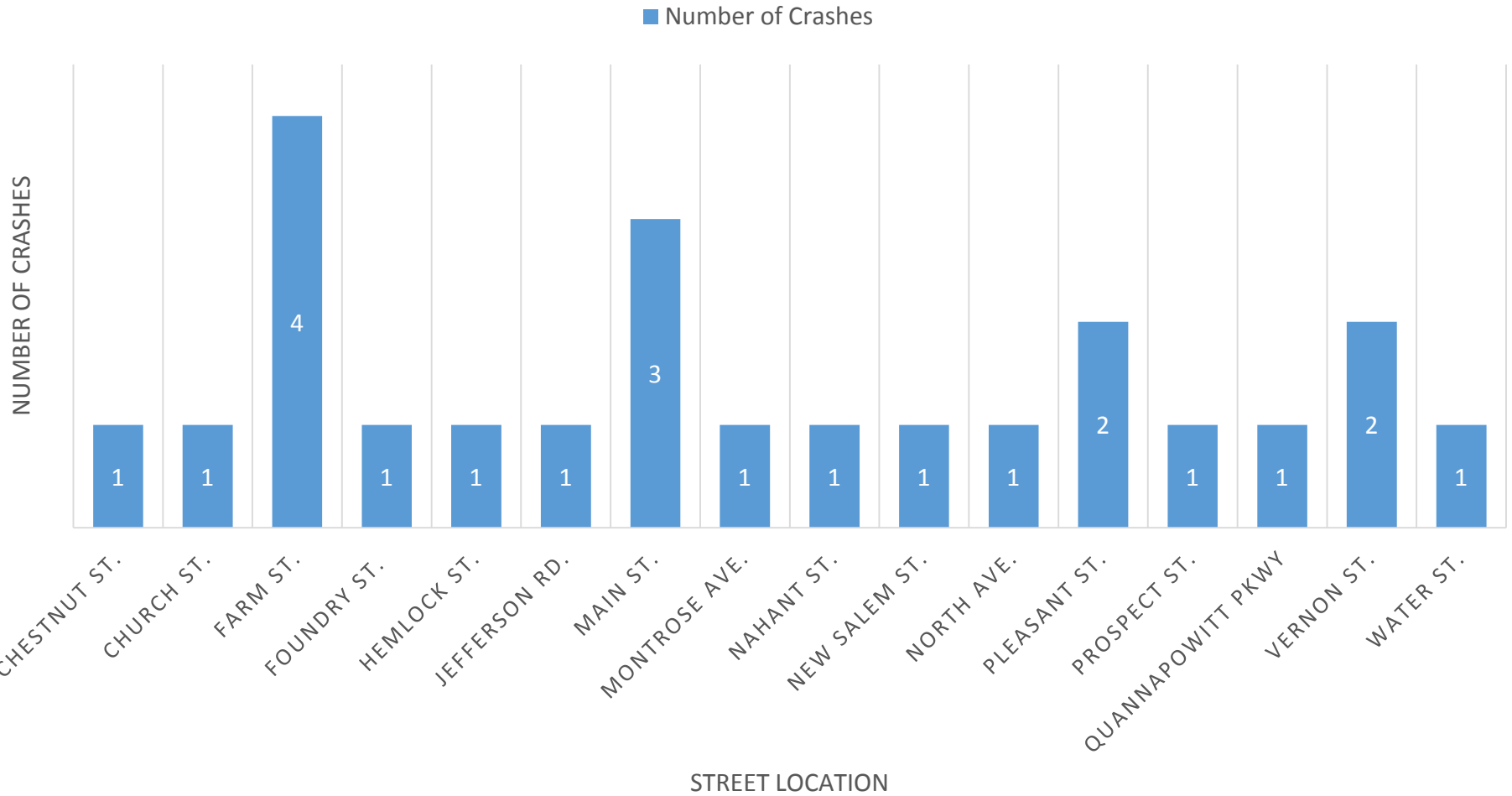

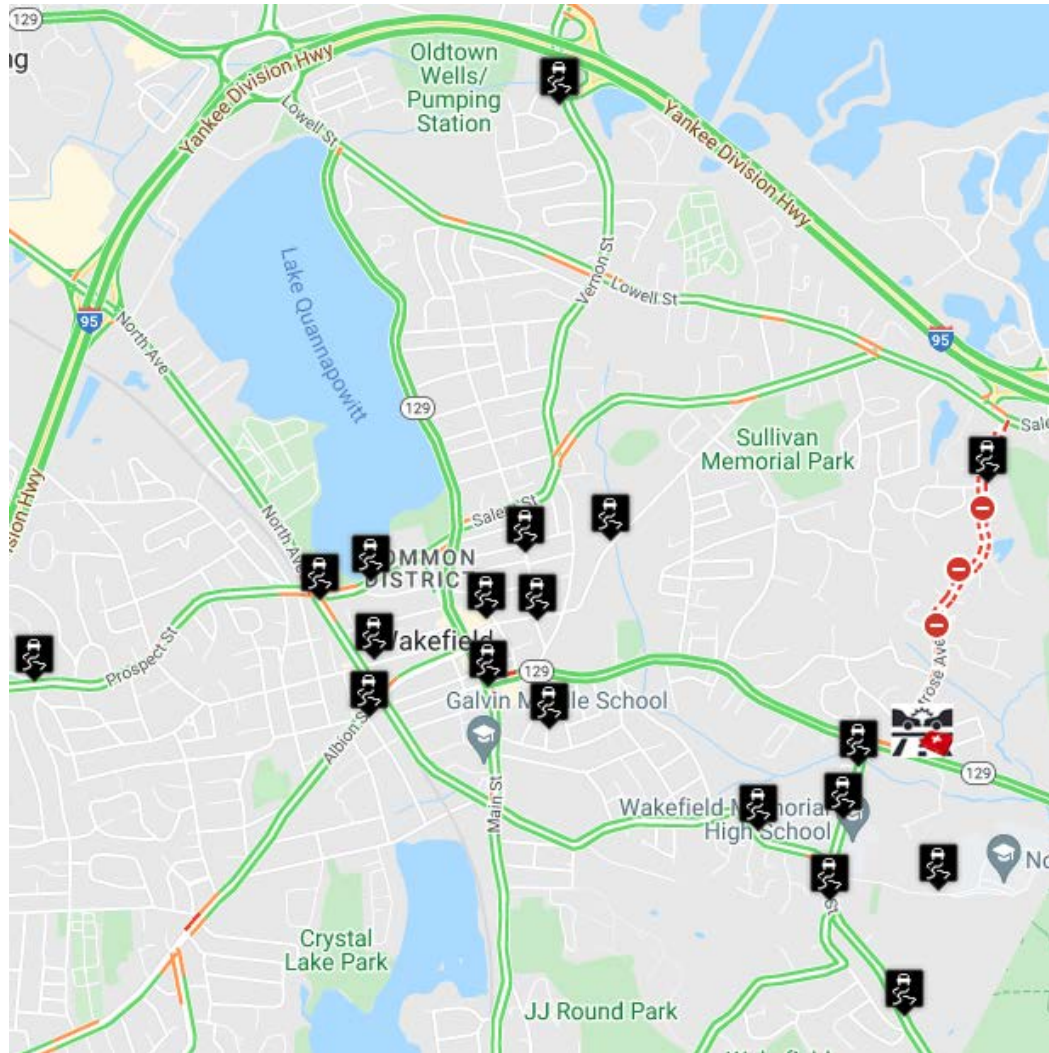


# CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:
