#### January 2023 Highlights

On January 7<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to the Genesis Health Care facility located at 1 Bathol Street for a male patient that was reported missing. Staff members reported a 60-year-old male left his first-floor unit through a window sometime during the overnight hours. The patient was described as mobile and moved well but also had some medical issues. Officers immediately began a search of the area that also included a K-9 for the wooded area that abuts the facility. Notifications were made to various agencies as we continued to gather information and continued to canvas the area. Fortunately, the patient was located safely in Boston.

On January 10<sup>th</sup>, officers responded to the MBTA station on Tuttle Street for a report of a male that had attempted to crawl under a moving train. Officers arrived on the scene and received an update that the male was now walking toward Albion Street. Officers were able to locate the individual, who was clearly in a mental health crisis, and engage him in conversation. After building a rapport with this individual, he was voluntarily transported to the hospital by Cataldo Ambulance for an evaluation

During the early morning hours of January 16<sup>th</sup>, Sergeant Burnham was on patrol in the area of Main Street and Richardson Avenue when his attention was drawn to a gray Landrover that sped by him at approximately 50 mph in a 20 mph zone. He caught up to the speeding vehicle on Main Street and activated his emergency lights. The vehicle quickly jerked to the right and abruptly came to a stop. He approached the female operator and observed her speech to be slurred and detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her breath. After further investigation, the female operator was taken into custody and charged with OUI Liquor (2<sup>nd</sup> Offense).

On January 26<sup>th</sup>, we were dispatched to the Dunkin Donuts at 225 North Avenue for a report of an individual causing a disturbance inside the business. Officers arrived and observed the male in the corner of the establishment making gestures with his hands and speaking in a nonsensical manner. They attempted to speak with him however he suddenly left the business and began walking down Albion Street while speaking to himself and looking up at the sky. He then began to walk in and out of traffic forcing motorists to stop suddenly. Officers were able stop him from entering traffic and attempted to de-escalate and engage in conversation. The male was in a mental health crisis and became volatile with the Officers. He was eventually transported to the hospital for an evaluation without further incident.

On January 27<sup>th</sup>, Officers responded to a home on Crescent Hill for a report of gun shots fired into a car parked in a driveway. Officers working dispatch received a 911 call with a detailed description of a suspect and vehicle seen leaving the area. Minutes later, Officer Haladay, who was working a paid construction detail, observed a vehicle matching the description given by dispatch. Officer Haladay and Sgt Burnham stopped the vehicle and the suspect was taken into custody without incident. A semi-automatic handgun was recovered from the center console of the vehicle. The male suspect out of Burlington, MA is facing multiple charges. Luckily nobody was injured during the very dangerous incident.

During the month of January, Detective Ken Silva went around to several of our local banks and business establishments that allow customers to withdraw or wire large sums of money to talk with them about many of the scams that are targeting our residents. This education included laminated cards that could be posted for customers in order to better protect them from victimization. Fortunately, many businesses and banks do have internal procedures in place to help identify suspicious activity. The additional information provided by Detective Silva was well-received and we appreciate the partnerships that we have with many of our local establishments.




