June 2020 Highlights

On June 1st, officers were dispatched to a hit and run crash that occurred in the area of Broadway and North Avenue. They spoke with the victim who reported that she was struck by a male operator which appeared to be a road rage type of incident as he made obscene gestures as he drove away. The sedan continued on North Avenue towards Reading. Wakefield units as well as surrounding cities and towns were unable to locate the suspect vehicle. Officers were able to determine the make and model of the vehicle and discover it was owned by a male party out of Plymouth, MA. Further investigation led them to a male party out of Chelsea that was the operator at the time of the crash. He is being summonsed to Malden District Court.

On June 12th, a mother reported that her adult daughter was missing and had sent suicidal messages after an argument on the phone. It was unknown where the daughter was staying and the only information that we had was that she may be at a hotel. Officers checked local hotels with no results. Her cell phone had been turned off as officers continued to work on this case. Several hours later Officer Lyons was able to make contact after her phone had been turned back on. Officer Lyons is highly skilled and trained in crisis intervention. He was able to calm her down and also establish that she was currently in Cambridge. She agreed to speak with only him in person. Sergeant Flynn was able to assist in confirming an exact location through cellphone analysis. Officer Lyons then responded to Cambridge with Cambridge PD officers in close proximity. He was able to talk her into getting help and she was transported to the hospital for further evaluation.

On June 13th, we received a 911 call to the parking lot at 380 Lowell Street for a report of a male party that had suffered a stab wound. Sergeant Powers and Officer DJ Morales arrived and observed a black SUV with the passenger door open. They approached and noticed a male covered in blood and a female attempting to assist. Officers secured the scene and immediately began treating a stab wound to the neck by applying direct pressure. They held this until the arrival of paramedics who determined that a med-flight would be needed due to the severity of the wound. The male was transported without further incident. The stabbing had occurred at a residence in Lynnfield and a family member had attempted to transport the male to a hospital. This case is under investigation by Lynnfield PD.

On June 15th, Officer Robert Pedersen was sworn in as our newest department member. Officer Pedersen previously worked for several years as a full-time officer with the Tufts University Police Department and has completed the Massachusetts Police Training Council Police Academy. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice and received high reviews from his co-workers and supervisors.

Throughout June several of our officers including Sergeant Jon Burnham, Detective Ken Silva, and Officer Joe Lyons assisted with multiple callouts to Boston as well as other area departments as part of the NEMLEC regional response teams to assist with protests. These have been long days in difficult situations and they have all performed admirably and represented the department and the Town of Wakefield very well.

All of our department members assisted with safety and security at the social justice march that took place here on June 7th. The large event was organized by several Wakefield High School students who did an excellent job. We were proud to be part of the process and the peaceful and powerful message was both well delivered and well received. This day is one that will be remembered for a very long time and once again showed the true spirit of our community.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex







Summons Arrests By Age / Sex






P.C. Arrests By Race, Sex and Age


CRASH LOCATIONS JUNE 2020
