June 2021 Highlights

On June 5th, Officer Shawn Conway was monitoring the Greenwood Plaza parking lot for underage customers walking into the liquor store. While watching this area he observed a male party enter a vehicle that was occupied by another male. While inside the vehicle, the behavior of the subjects was consistent with a drug transaction. The male exited the vehicle quickly with his right hand in a fist and appeared to be holding something. A traffic stop was conducted. After further investigation, it was determined that the male operating the vehicle had sold oxycodone pills to the second male party. He is facing drug distribution charges out of Malden District Court.

On June 17th, officers were dispatched to the Wakefield Rehabilitation Center on Bathol Street for a missing male party with dementia. Upon arrival, they were informed that an elderly male was not in his room and had left at an unknown time. Officers immediately began searching the area and looking for additional information. After multiple calls, they were able to determine that a staff member observed him leave with his brother in a vehicle earlier in the day. Officers then attempted to make contact with the brother at his last known address however they were not there. The follow-up continued and they were able to locate the resident safely at a hotel in Revere with his brother.

On June 27th, Officer Jeanette DeMasi was on patrol near the Greenwood School when she was flagged down by a pedestrian who reported he had just witnessed a vehicle traveling on the wrong side of the road. As the Officer was speaking with the witness they observed the same vehicle heading towards them, still on the wrong side of the road. A Honda SUV was witnessed travelling northbound on Main Street in the southbound lane. Officer Demasi immediately attempted to conduct a motor vehicle stop. The SUV continued travelling at approximately 30 mph while swerving all over the roadway and eventually pulled over in the area of Railroad Avenue. After further investigation, the female operator was charged with Operating Under the Influence of Drugs.


On June 30th, Officers were dispatched to a residence for an adult male attempting to harm himself. When Officers arrived, they removed any dangerous objects from the interior area of the home as the subject was volatile and yelling at officers. Officers were eventually able to de-escalate the situation and he agreed to walk out of the house. The dialogue continued and he later entered an ambulance voluntarily and was transported to the hospital for evaluation without incident.

In June, the Wakefield Police Department welcomed our newest K-9 "Samy" who was issued to her handler Officer Kelley Tobyne. Samy will be used as a Comfort Dog and will be based out of the Galvin Middle School. The function of the Comfort Dog is to provide interaction during investigations involving children or adults to reduce anxiety and increase communication between the adult or child victim/witness and investigators, to provide comfort for people during times of crisis, and to provide aid and comfort to individuals, groups, and communities impacted by violence, tragedy or

traumatic events. The Comfort Dog is also a valuable tool in fostering dialog and communications between the police department and the community we serve. She has been a huge hit so far with all ages and we look forward to many great years ahead.

Unfortunately this month, we mourned the loss of Worcester Police Officer Emmanuel “Manny” Familia who died in the line of duty attempting to save a group of youths from drowning. This was a selfless act by a first responder to save someone he had never met and unfortunately he lost his life. In a cruel twist, Officer Familia’s family was not eligible for the benefits usually reserved for the family of a fallen police officer because drowning is not included in the state’s statute covering line of duty deaths. Legislations was immediately filed to change this law. Several Wakefield Officers attended Officer Familia’s funeral to pay respect to this hero and our thoughts and prayers are with his family.

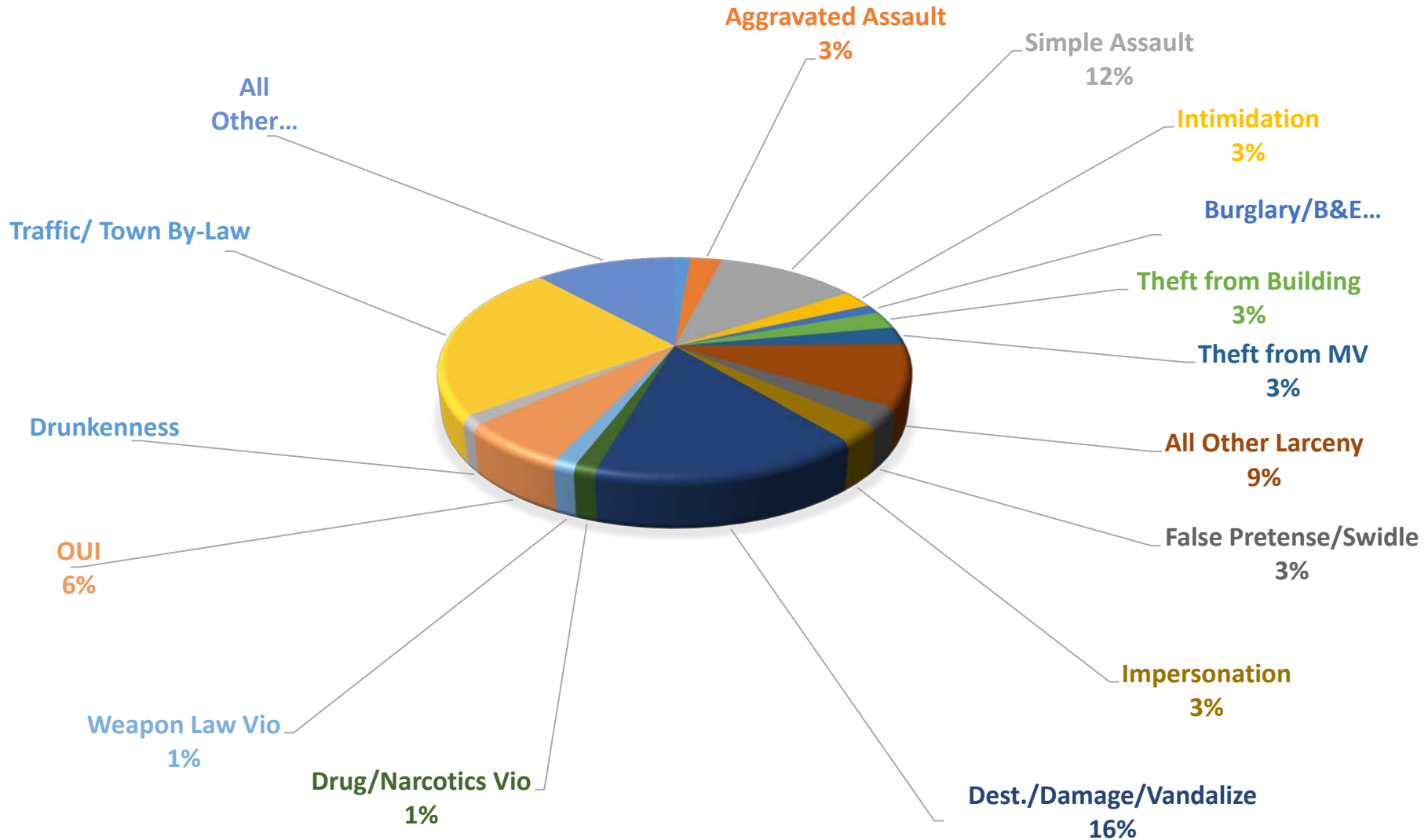

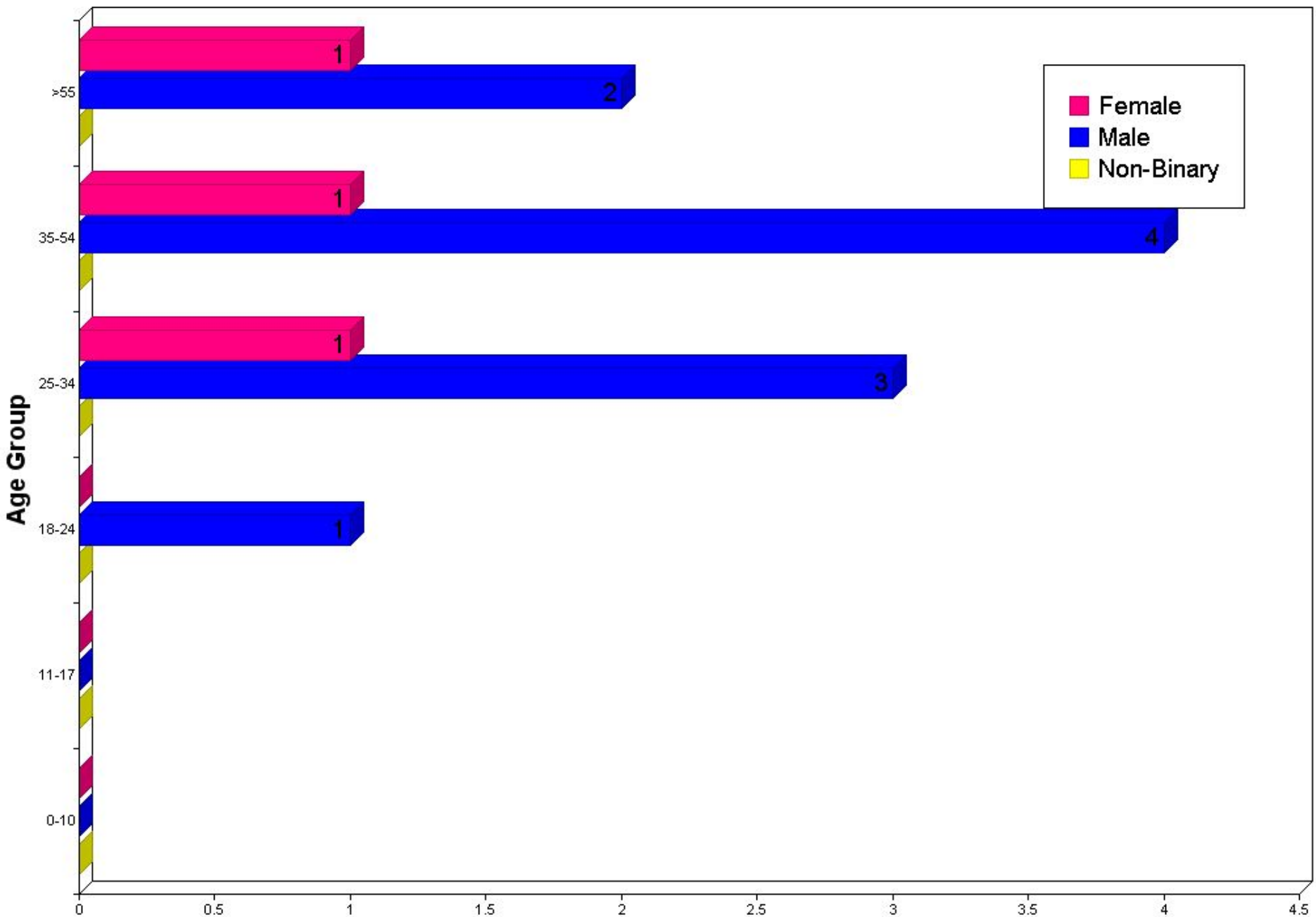

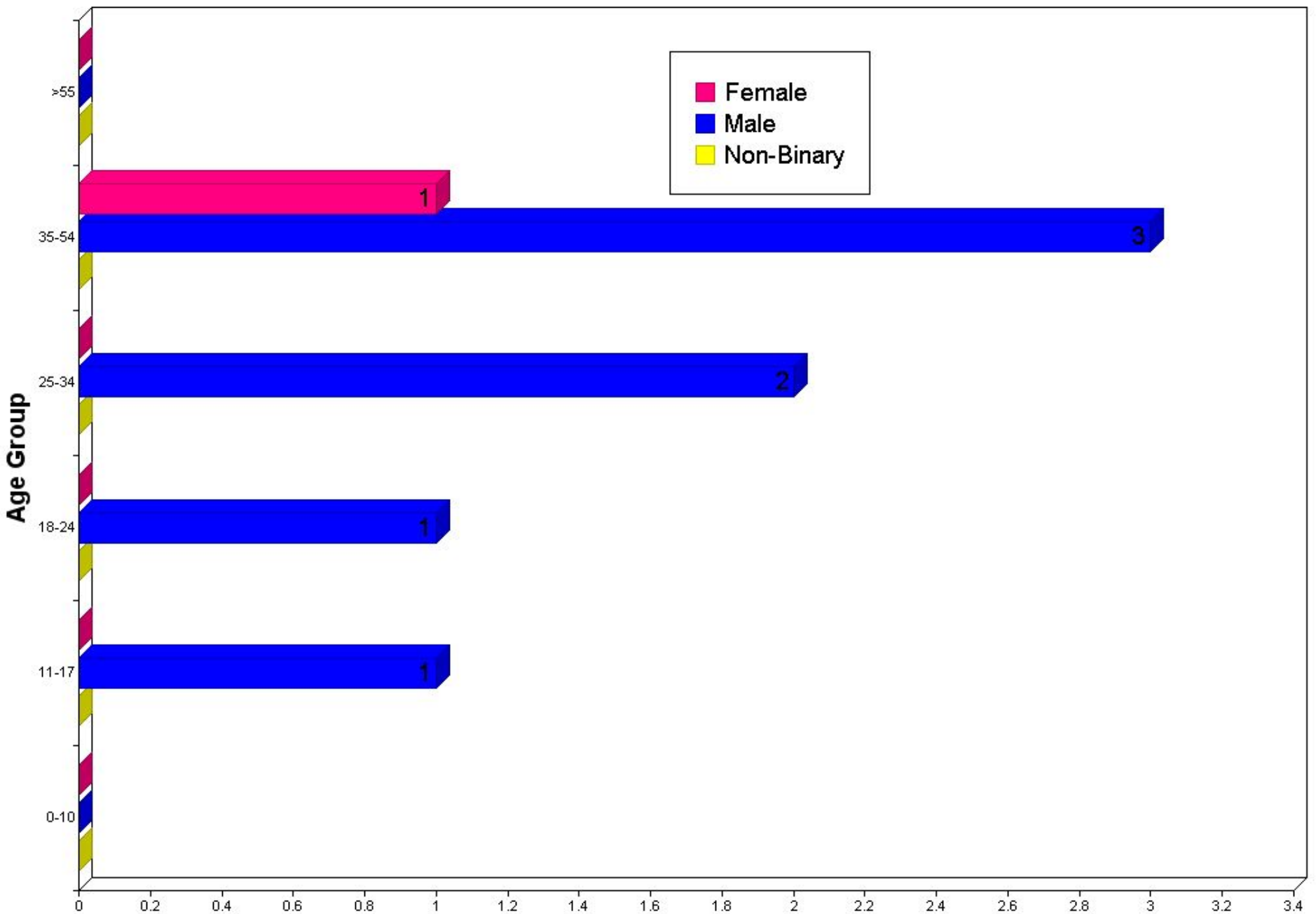

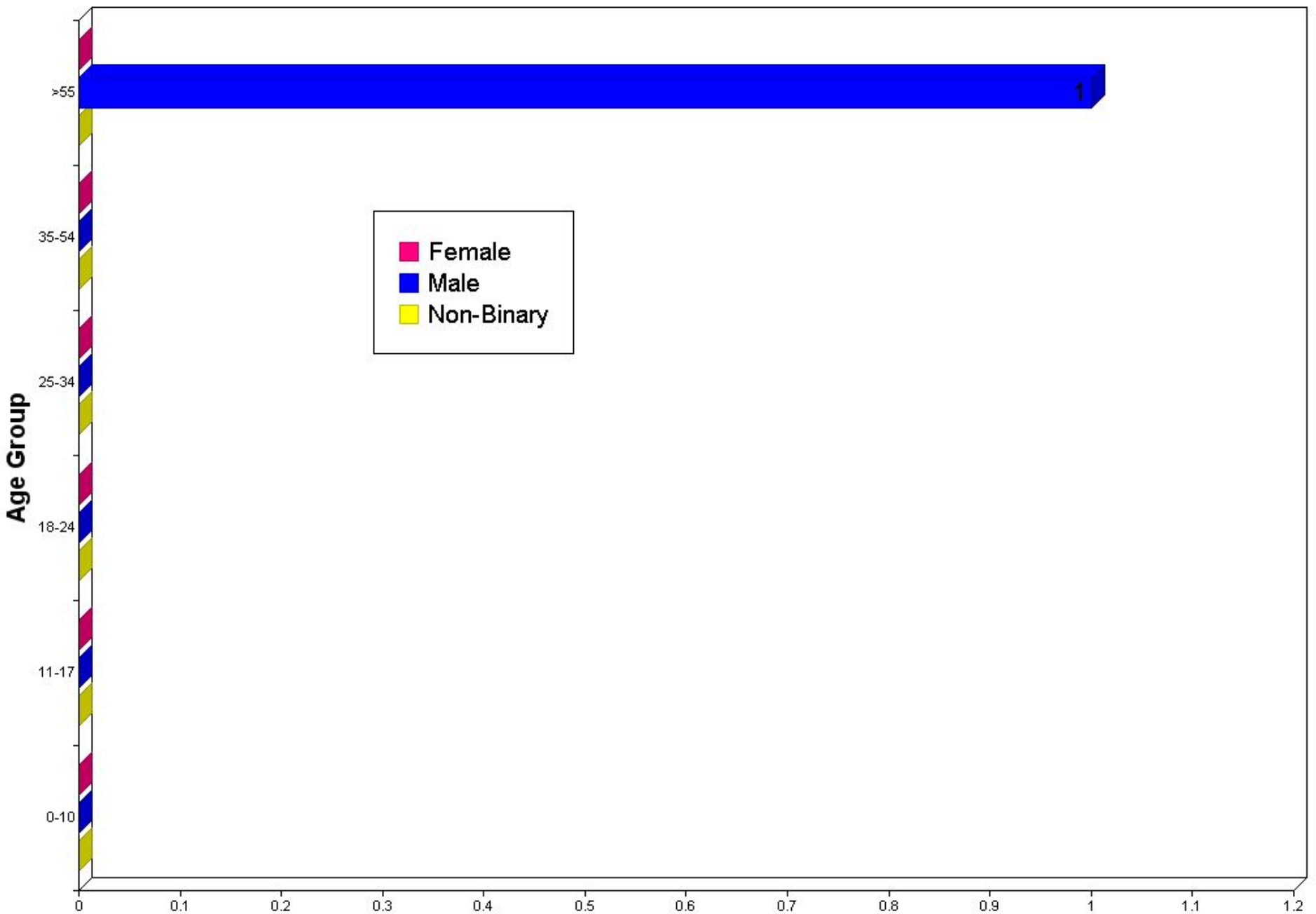

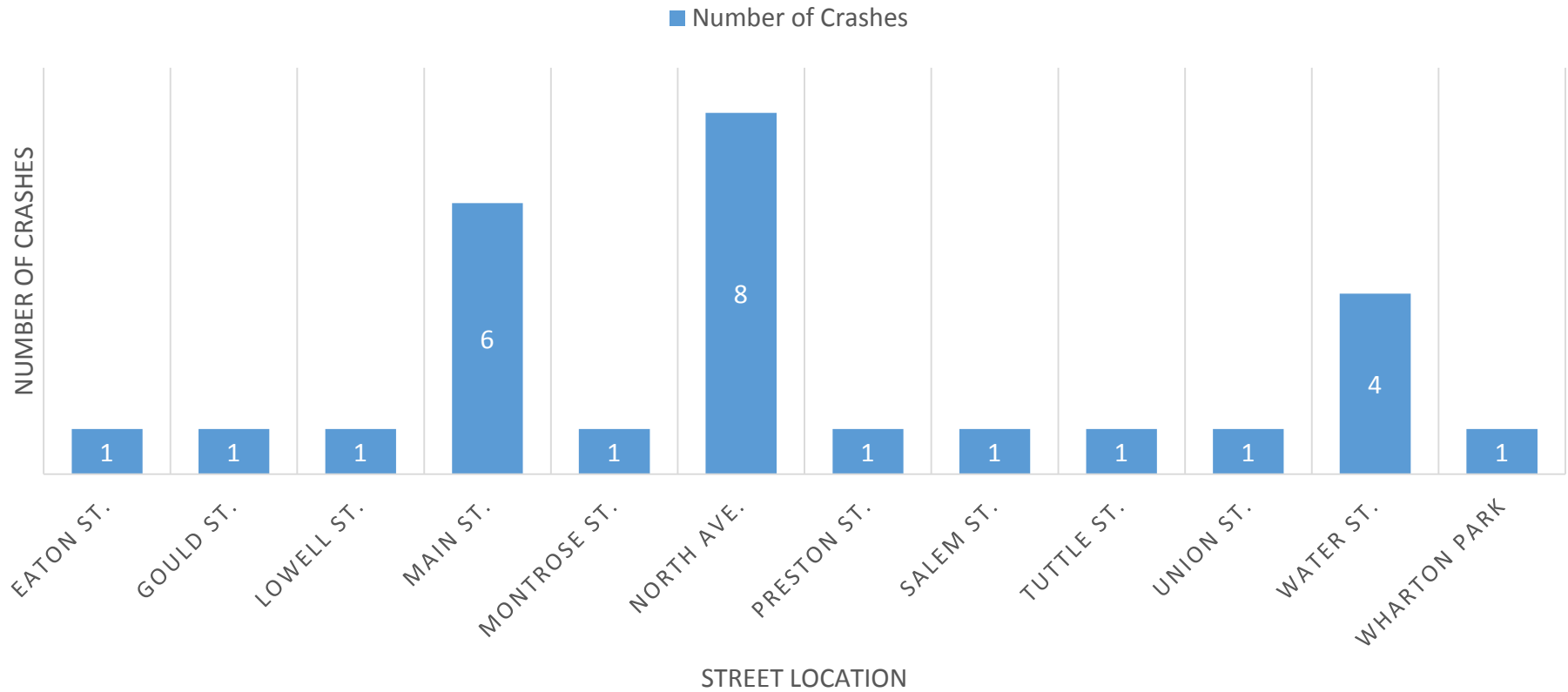

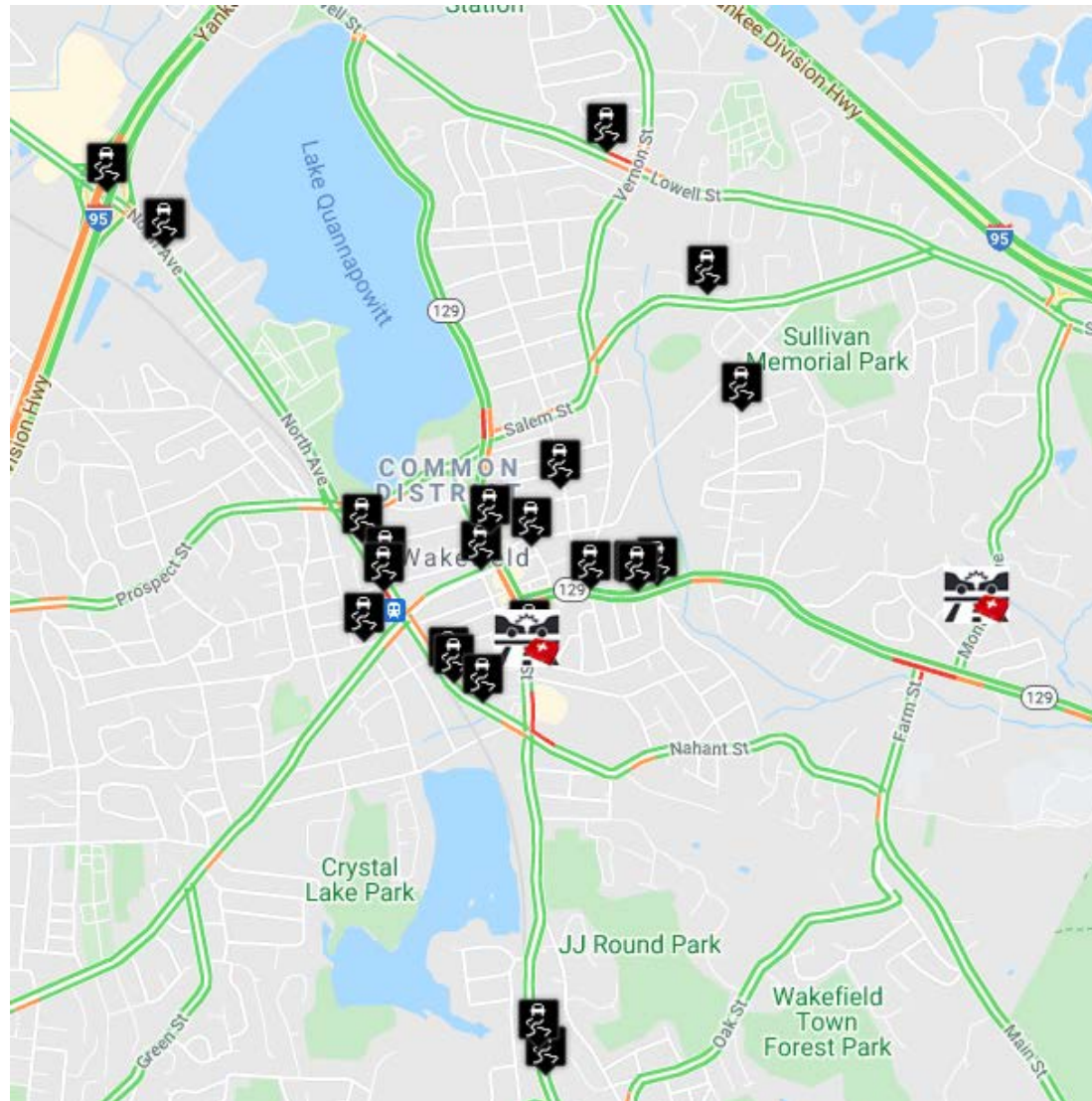


CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:
