June 2022 Highlights

On June 8th, a resident of Water Street reported that her two-year-old daughter had been taken from the home by the father, who did not have custody rights to the child. The father had left in a black Subaru and police units immediately began looking for the vehicle. Officers continued to gather information and communicated promptly to surrounding cities and towns. After a short while, the father and child were located safely by the Cambridge Police Department and the mother was reunited with her child without incident.

On June 11th, Officers were dispatched to a residence on Lakeview Avenue for a report of a past larceny. The victim advised that some delivered items had been stolen from her front porch. The victim then began receiving messages on Facebook about the missing merchandise. After an investigation, Officers were able to identify an area resident who had stolen the items. The suspect is facing charges through Malden District Court.

On June 12th, Officers were dispatched to an apartment complex in Greenwood for a report of a female in a mental health crisis. Upon arrival, they could hear yelling from inside one of the rear apartments. After attempting to speak with the individual they determined she was a danger to herself and others and made entry into the apartment. The apartment was in disarray with multiple broken objects strewn about. They employed deescalation techniques for an extended period of time. Eventually, the individual was transported to the hospital for an evaluation.

On June 18th, we received a call from a mother reporting her adult daughter had made statements that she was planning to harm herself. Officers immediately responded to the residence and spoke with the mother. Prior to Officers arriving, the daughter had left in a vehicle. Officers immediately began gathering information and attempted to locate the daughter. Shortly thereafter, officers observed the car in Wakefield traveling at a high rate of speed. The vehicle eventually came to a stop in a driveway and officers approached. They were able to de-escalate the female and establish a rapport. She was transported to the hospital for evaluation without incident.

During the month of June, we conducted another Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) training for our residents. R.A.D. is internationally recognized for quality and organizational commitment to excellence. R.A.D. balances the needs of women to acquire self-defense education in a relatively short period, with the lifelong commitment required for physical skill mastery. R.A.D. Instructors share life-saving information with confidence, knowing that their lessons will be continuously reinforced. This was another great class and we thank officers Meaghan Roberto, Amy Rando, Kelley Tobyne, and Mark O'Brien for all of their efforts.

The Wakefield Police Department would like to congratulate Officer Matthew Warren who received the "Law Enforcement Exemplary Performance Award" at the 2022 Law Enforcement/Mental Health Conference in Fitchburg on June 29. Mental illness and behavioral health issues are some of the most challenging issues that our officers work with. We are fortunate to have such an outstanding group of officers that consistently perform at a high level, as well as strong support from our social services personnel. Officer Warren has been with the department since 2007. He mentors new officers as a Field Training Officer (FTO) and is a member of our Crisis Intervention Team (CIT). Officer Warren excels in multiple aspects of policing and has been a leader in this area for many years. He provides dedicated services to our citizens and looks to build a rapport and understand the needs of the individual. Officer Warren positively impacts the Town of Wakefield by demonstrating proactive collaborative efforts and teamwork around issues related to mental health and law enforcement.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex














STREET LOCATION
