May 2021 Highlights

On May 5th, Officers were dispatched to a group home for an out-of-control client that was throwing items throughout the residence. Upon arriving, the Officers were met by the client, who was clearly agitated. Officers were able to de-escalate the individual and speak with a staff member. The staff member reported that he had suffered an injury during the event and he was subsequently transported to the hospital. Officers were able to talk the client into an ambulance without further incident and he was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.

On May 12th, School Resource Officer Mike Pietrantonio was notified by staff at the Northeast Vocational School that a student suffering an emotional crisis had left the school on foot without permission. He and other Wakefield Officers immediately began to search the Breakheart Reservation area, but they were unable to locate the student. Officer Pietrantonio responded back to the school and met with the student's parents and administrative staff. Other area police departments were notified and through a collaborative effort, the student was located a short time later in Malden. The student was unharmed and turned over to the custody of his parents.

On May 15th, Sergeant Matt Powers was dispatched to the area of Wiley Place for a report of a drone flying around a residence. Upon arrival, he was able to locate a male party with a drone controller in his hand. He recognized this individual as someone that we have dealt with in the past in regards to harassment issues in that area. A tenant of an apartment on Wiley Place was able to obtain video of the drone flying in close proximity to a window of his apartment. Sgt. Powers continued with an extensive investigation, as drone cases do present complex issues. After a well-documented report, this male party is facing multiple charges through Malden District Court for harassment.

On May 20th, a cell phone caller reported a vehicle being operated erratically, heading inbound from Saugus onto Farm Street. The vehicle made a left turn from Farm St onto Water Street where officers first made observation of the vehicle, which had heavy front end damage and one flat tire. As Officers attempted to stop the vehicle, sparks could be seen coming from beneath the vehicle. The vehicle continued westbound at approximately 25 mph heading past Preston Street. Officer Gover was coming in the opposite direction as the vehicle approached Cyrus Street. At this time the vehicle was not able to negotiate the slight bend in the roadway, crossed over the center line, and struck the police cruiser. Officer Gover was later transported to the hospital to be checked and fortunately, he did not suffer any significant injuries. The male operator of the suspect vehicle was arrested and charged with multiple motor vehicle offenses.

On May 25th, officers were dispatched to a call reporting a younger male wearing a vest and holding a firearm in a front yard of a residence. As they approached they observed the male toss an object. He then placed his hands in the air. Officers approached

cautiously and were able to stabilize the situation without incident. The teenage male had tossed an airsoft gun that looked like a firearm. The officers were able to speak with the parents a short while later and advise them of the dangerous situation that this presented.

On May 1st, we hosted a car safety seat installation event for all community members. Sgt. Kevin McCaul, Off. Amy Rando, and Off. Kelley Tobyne worked hard throughout the morning assisting parents and grandparents with proper car seat installations. This is an extremely popular program that we also run by appointment throughout the year. We had a busy day and we appreciate the partnership with Subaru of Wakefield and owner Sal Barbagallo for allowing us the use of their facility.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex








P.C. Arrests By Race, Sex and Age



CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:








CRASH LOCATION MAP:
