April 2023 Highlights

On April 4th, during the over-night shift, Sergeant Matt Powers was patrolling Main Street when he observed a vehicle traveling in the wrong direction on the one-way portion of Albion Street. Sgt Powers was able to stop the vehicle on Albion Street and speak with the female operator. He observed that she appeared confused, was sweating profusely and had vomited all over the center console of her vehicle. Additionally, Sgt. Powers was able to detect an odor of an alcoholic beverage. After further investigation, the vehicle operator was taken into custody and charged with OUI Liquor (2nd Offense).

On April 7th, Officer DJ Morales was on patrol in the area of Main Street and Meriam Street when his attention was drawn to an approaching motor vehicle that was traveling at a high rate of speed. The cruiser-mounted radar indicated a speed of 55 MPH and steadily climbing. He immediately turned around and was able to conduct a traffic stop of a white Nissan sedan in the area of Main Street and Green Street. A registry check showed 35 recent queries from surrounding police departments as well as a "stop and hold" request from the Massachusetts State Police. After further investigation, the male operator was taken into custody and charged with Operating without a License and Operating to Endanger.

On April 22nd, officers were dispatched to a residence to check on a male that had made threats of self-harm through text messages to a friend. Officers located the individual in his basement and learned through conversation that he had been experiencing mental health issues and was


currently not in a good state of mind. Officers explained that they were there to help and continued the dialogue. He was eventually transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.

On April 25th, officers were dispatched to the area of North Avenue and Church Street for a male causing a disturbance. Upon arrival, they observed a male that is well known to the police department for his mental health issues. This male can be volatile and had been observed by a citizen jumping in and out of traffic. Officers approached and were able to speak with him and keep him in a relatively calm state. He was eventually transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation and our clinician conducted follow-up with members of his treatment team.

On April 29th, officers responded to an apartment on Chestnut Street for a report of a female screaming for help. After knocking on the door of the unit and receiving no answer they proceeded to the fire escape/rear door of the unit, which was also locked with no answer. With the assistance of the Fire Department, a ladder was propped up against the building and officers made entry through a second floor window. Once inside, they located a female suffering from a mental health crisis and who was in a volatile state. Nobody else was located in the apartment. Ambulance personnel arrived and attempted further care but were also met with resistance and hostility. The female resident was eventually transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation.

On April 26th, the WPD Honor Guard was invited to present the colors at the first-ever Salute to Service game for the Wakefield Memorial High School boys lacrosse program. We were grateful to have taken part in this special ceremony to honor our military veterans past and present. Thanks to Sergeant Burnham, Detective Silva, Officer Rando, and Officer O'Brien for representing our department well.










CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:
