

### June 2023 Highlights

On June 5<sup>th</sup>, Boston PD put out a BOLO (Be on the Lookout) for a vehicle belonging to an overdue elderly motorist. Officer Meaghan Roberto was working traffic enforcement and observed a vehicle matching the description in the area of Water Street and Vernon Street. She was able to verify a match and conducted a stop of the vehicle. The elderly gentleman was transported to the police station, where he was reunited with a family member.

On June 7<sup>th</sup>, we received a report of a "road rage" incident that occurred at the intersection of Main Street and Forest Street. One of the vehicles left the area after the driver threatened the driver of the second vehicle. The vehicle that left was described as a red Honda Fit. Sergeant Geoff Eriksen located the Honda on Richardson Street near Main Street and conducted a motor vehicle stop. After further investigation, the driver was charged with several motor vehicle violations and will be summoned to Malden District Court.

On June 8<sup>th</sup>, a caller reported two individuals using narcotics in a blue Cadillac in the parking lot of Shaw's Supermarket. When Officers arrived, they located a blue Cadillac with a male sitting in the driver's seat and a female in the passenger seat.

After approaching the vehicle, the officers observed several small baggies full of pills between the legs of the driver. They spoke with the male who became belligerent and uncooperative. As officers attempted to remove the male from the vehicle he resisted and told the female to run, but officers were able to gain control of both individuals. A large quantity of illegal drugs were located inside the vehicle and both the male and female were taken into custody. They were charged with a number of drugs offenses, including "Trafficking in more than 10 grams of Fentanyl".

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, Officer Rob Haladay and Detective Ken Silva were dispatched to a residence to investigate a report of a missing juvenile. They spoke with the juvenile's father who reported his daughter had not come home after going out the previous evening. Officers began a search for the missing female, which included looking at common places that she visits and contacting any of her known acquaintances. They established a few leads and followed up on many potential areas that included Saugus. Eventually, they found the missing juvenile at a residence in Wakefield and she was returned safely to her family.

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, an 80-year-old female came to the police station to report she was in need of housing assistance. Family Services Officer Amy Rando discovered the woman was staying at a local hotel after recently losing her apartment. Officer Rando along with clinician Jennifer spent several hours making calls and assisting with application paperwork. They were able to find extended temporary housing and connect her with additional resources to help pursue a longer-term solution.

During the last week of June, our School Resource Officers Kelley Tobyne and Matt Malone worked with the Wakefield Recreation Department and Director Dan McGrath on a four-day youth camp. This was a huge success with over 100 kids attending. Thanks to Dan and all of his staff for making this a great week for all involved.

Congratulations to Officer Amy Rando for receiving the "Spotlight Award" from the Wakefield Alliance Against Violence (WAAV) at their recent annual meeting. She is a past President of this organization and a leader in the fight to end Domestic Violence. Off. Rando spearheaded the annual "Race to End Domestic Violence" road race that has raised \$47,000 since its inception. Her dedication and determination are unwavering and we appreciate all of her efforts.

Sergeant Mike Ryan retired on June 27<sup>th</sup> and we wish him a long and happy retirement. Officer DJ Morales was promoted to Sergeant on June 28<sup>th</sup> to fill Sgt. Ryan's vacancy. Sgt Morales has been with the department for six years and serves on the motorcycle unit, bicycle unit and as a Field Training Officer.










