October 2020 Highlights

On October 1st, Officer Russell Carman was in the area of New Salem Street when he was flagged down by a passing motorist alerting him to a possible fight in the area of Independent Concrete. He quickly responded and was met by a group of "First Amendment Auditors". The group was videotaping and attempting to instigate a fight with the business owner. There was a heated exchange between the parties and officers were able to diffuse the situation. First Amendment Auditors create situations that require a police response so they can videotape and harass police officers during the course of their duty. In this case, the "auditors" were sent on their way without incident.

On October 5th, officers were dispatched to the area of Valley Street for a report of a domestic disturbance between two females. As they arrived, officers were informed that one of the involved had left the area in a dark-colored truck and the operator was reported to be intoxicated. Shortly thereafter Sgt. Matt Powers was able to locate a vehicle matching the description. He approached the female operator and began a discussion. During this time he detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage and her speech was slurred. Following a series of field sobriety tests, she was taken into custody and charged with OUI Liquor (4th Offense).

On October 6th, Officers were dispatched to a Greenwood address for a report of a suicidal male. Upon arrival, they were directed to the backyard where the subject had tied a cinder block to his waist and was leaning into an in-ground pool. Officers were able to get the male out of the pool and into a chair. After some discussion, he agreed to be transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. Additional follow-up was conducted with hospital staff as well as the spouse by our mental health clinician.

On October 10th, officers were dispatched to a Montrose area residence for a runaway juvenile. Officer John Whaley arrived and spoke with the mother who advised that her son was dealing with significant emotional issues and was a threat to himself. Officers immediately began searching for the individual and Officer Whaley located the juvenile in the area of the Galvin Middle School. The youth was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. The Family Services Officer and mental health clinician followed up with the family.

On October 18th, officers were dispatched to a head-on motor vehicle crash on Lowell Street near Main Street. Upon arrival, they observed two vehicles with heavy front end damage. A large group of individuals were gathered next to a Cadillac and were yelling that the operator was trapped inside. All airbags were deployed and a male party with shallow breathing was stuck inside. Officers quickly cut the seatbelt and the airbags to pull him out to a safe area and began CPR. This individual had apparent serious injuries and was transported to the hospital along with the operator of the other motor vehicle. The scene was then secured and an extensive investigation followed with assistance from the State Police Accident Reconstruction Team.

On October 25th, officers were dispatched to a Richardson Avenue address for a report of a female causing a disturbance on a fire escape. Upon arrival, Officer Whaley observed the female in question to be highly agitated and having a conversation with herself. Officer Whaley engaged in conversation and after a few moments the female stood up and began waving a steak knife in his direction. Additional units arrived and they worked through the situation using de-escalation skills from their training and experience. Eventually, they were able to talk her into putting the knife down and she was transported to the hospital without incident for a mental health evaluation.

We would like to congratulate Officer Joe Lyons for receiving our most recent "Officer of the Quarter" award for his efforts on a mental health call. Officers were dispatched to an apartment on Audubon Road for a male in crisis. It was reported by family members that he was inside a closet armed with a hammer. While speaking with the subject he displayed irrational thoughts and behavior. Officer Lyons was able to establish a rapport with him and was able to talk the individual into an ambulance. The male had harmed himself, but was transported to the hospital without incident.





Arrests On View & Based on Incident/Warrants By Age / Sex








P.C. Arrests By Race, Sex and Age

CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:




CRASH LOCATIONS OCTOBER 2020
