September 2021 Highlights

On September 2nd, officers responded to a residence to check on a person's well-being. Upon arrival, they spoke with a female party who stated her adult son had left the residence in an agitated state and she was concerned he may harm himself. This individual suffers from mental health disorders and made concerning statements before leaving the house in possession of a knife. Officers searched the area for his vehicle while dispatch made a broadcast to surrounding cities and towns. We were able to track the subject to a field in North Andover. The subject had not harmed himself and was eventually transported to the hospital for an evaluation.

On September 6th, officers were dispatched to a disturbance involving a male party who was outside a residence causing a commotion. Upon arrival, Officers located the male party, who was visibly intoxicated and playing loud music in the driveway. The subject's behavior immediately became volatile as officers attempted to communicate with him. A neighbor approached the Officers and indicated the subject's behavior was unsafe for his family. This further enraged the subject who then began threatening everyone on scene. He was taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct and continued his volatile and belligerent behavior throughout the booking process.

On September 8th, officers spoke to a female party in the lobby who was concerned for her adult son as well as her own safety due to his threatening and volatile behavior. The son suffers from mental health issues, had stopped taking his medications and was allegedly experiencing a psychotic episode. Officers and our clinician responded to the residence and were able to make contact with the male at the front door. They were able to calm the subject and have him transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. Officer Carman had established a rapport with the individual and followed the ambulance until he was turned over to hospital staff.

On September 9th, we received a call from a male party stating he was on the train tracks and threatening suicide. Officers immediately responded and began checking several areas of the tracks as the caller was not giving accurate information for his location. Shortly thereafter he claimed that he was in Reading, then later stated that he was back in Wakefield. This continued for some time while Detective Silva established a dialogue with him via cell phone. After an extended period, the male subject agreed to meet Detective Silva and our clinician Jennifer in the area of Walgreens. They were able to make the connection and he was transported to the hospital for an evaluation without incident.

On September 16th, we received a report of a fraudulent check cashed at the Eastern Bank in Wakefield for the amount of \$1,982. The check was forged using a fake name and address out of Rhode Island. Detective Sgt. DiNanno took as much information as the bank could provide and began running this through multiple search databases. After an extensive investigation, he was able to find a possible match to a male out of Rhode Island with a similar first and last name. This individual currently had a default warrant issued for him for similar crimes. Sgt Dinanno was able to obtain a photo that matched the photo from the bank surveillance footage. Charges were filed through Malden District Court.

On September 18th, we received a 911 call reporting a serious injury to a juvenile football player from the Northeast Vocational School during a junior varsity game. Sergeant Beede and Officer Warren were the first on scene and immediately assisted the trainer in performing CPR. They were able to keep the player stable until the arrival of EMTs and Paramedics from the Fire Department and Cataldo Ambulance. Their efforts were essential to his well-being during this challenging and unfortunate incident.

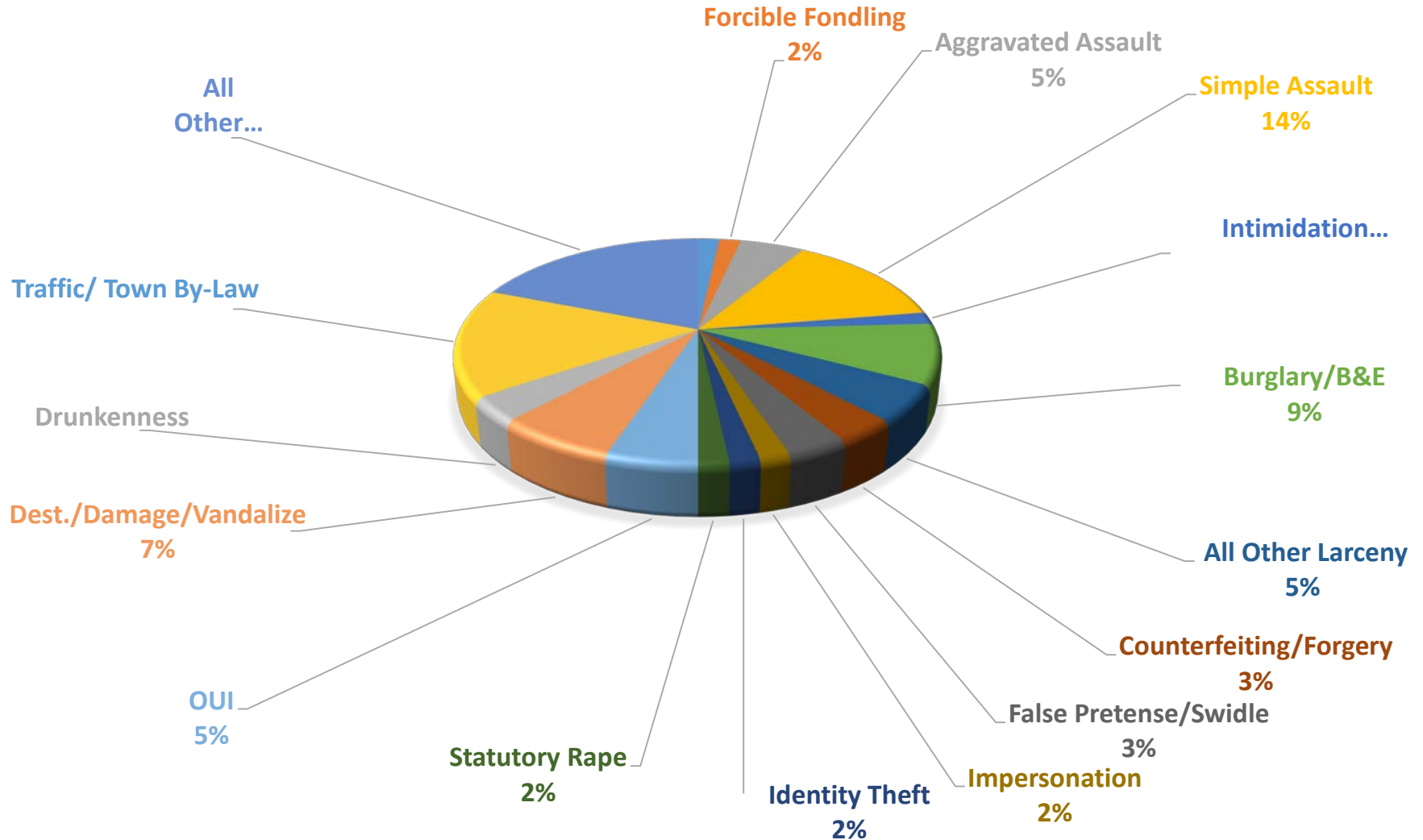

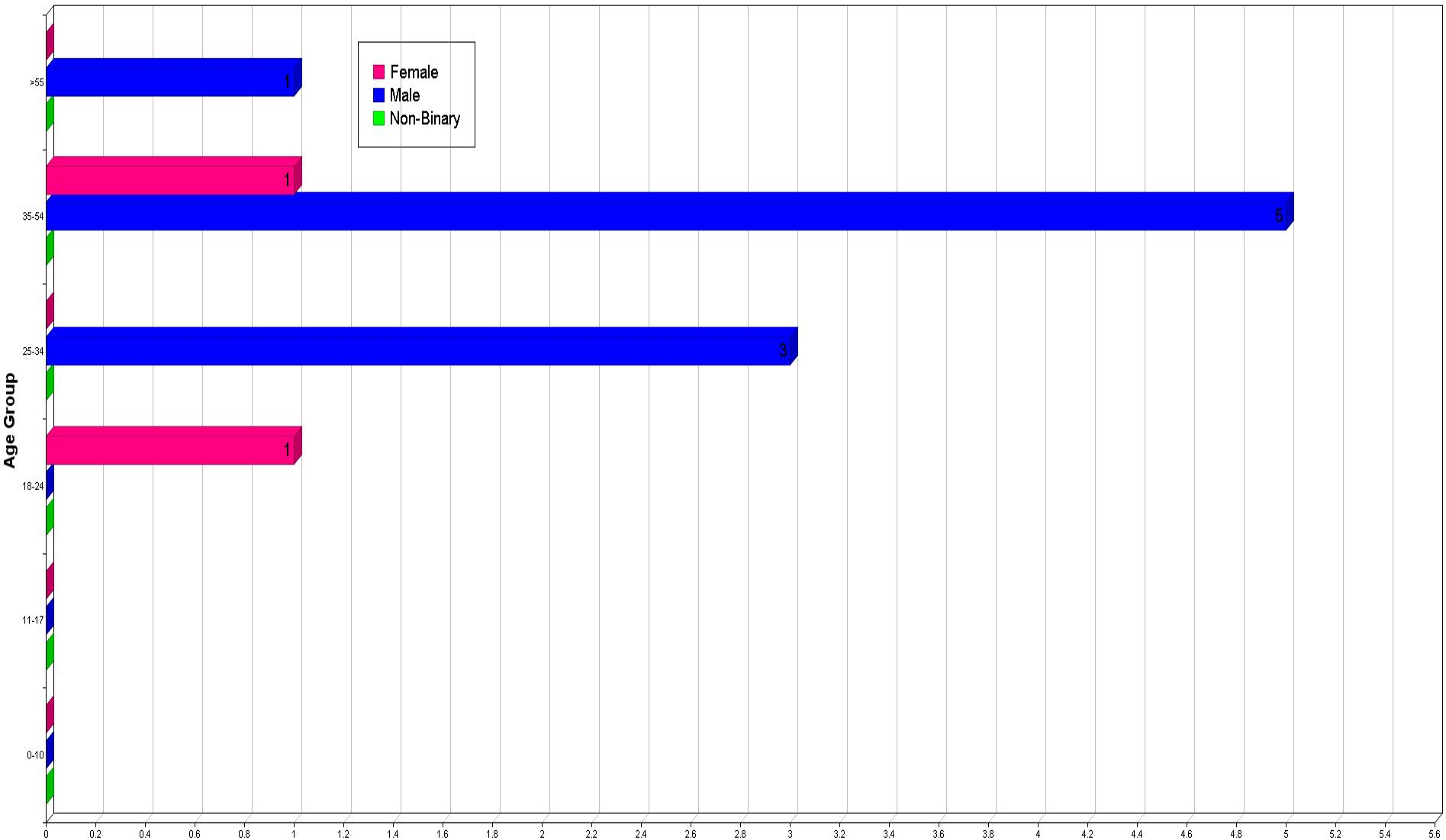

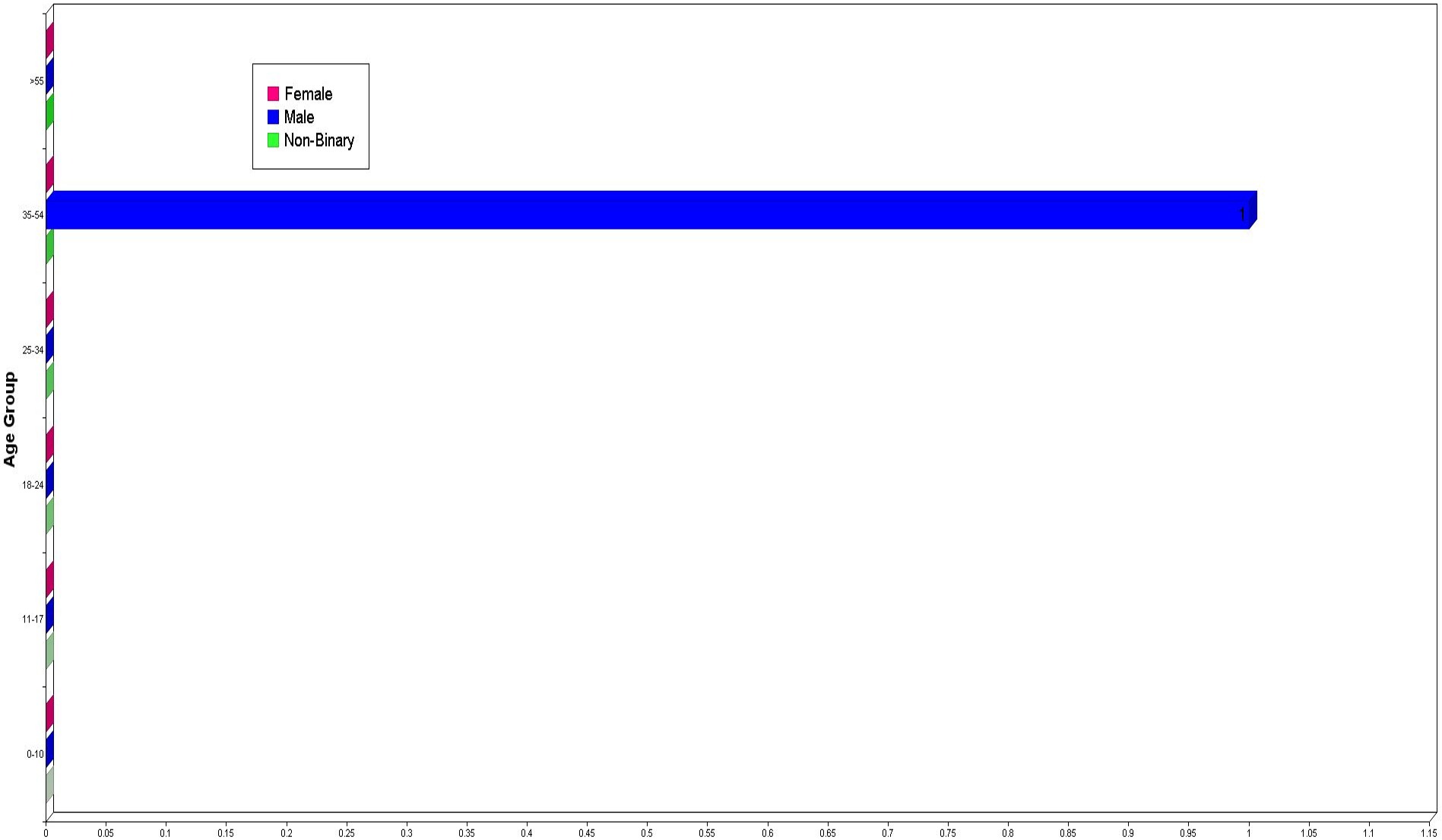

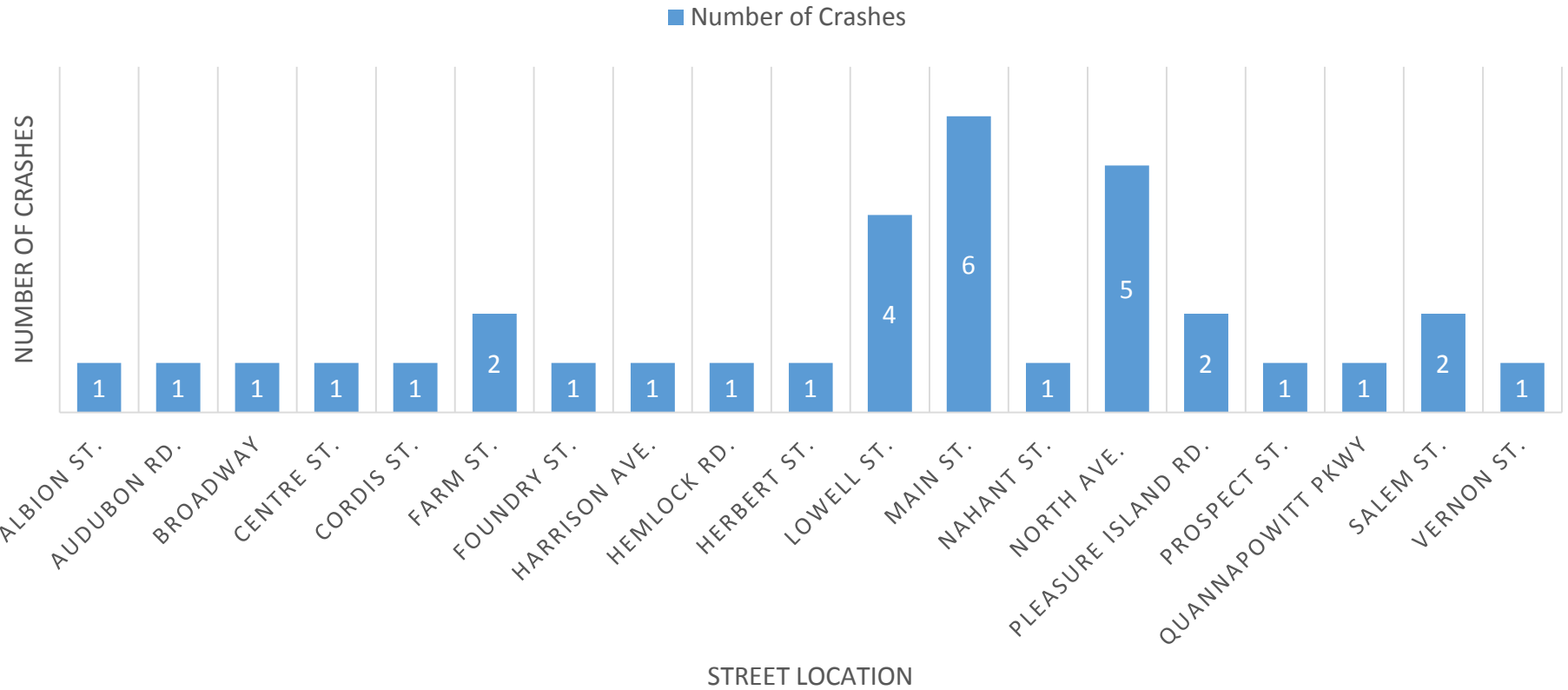

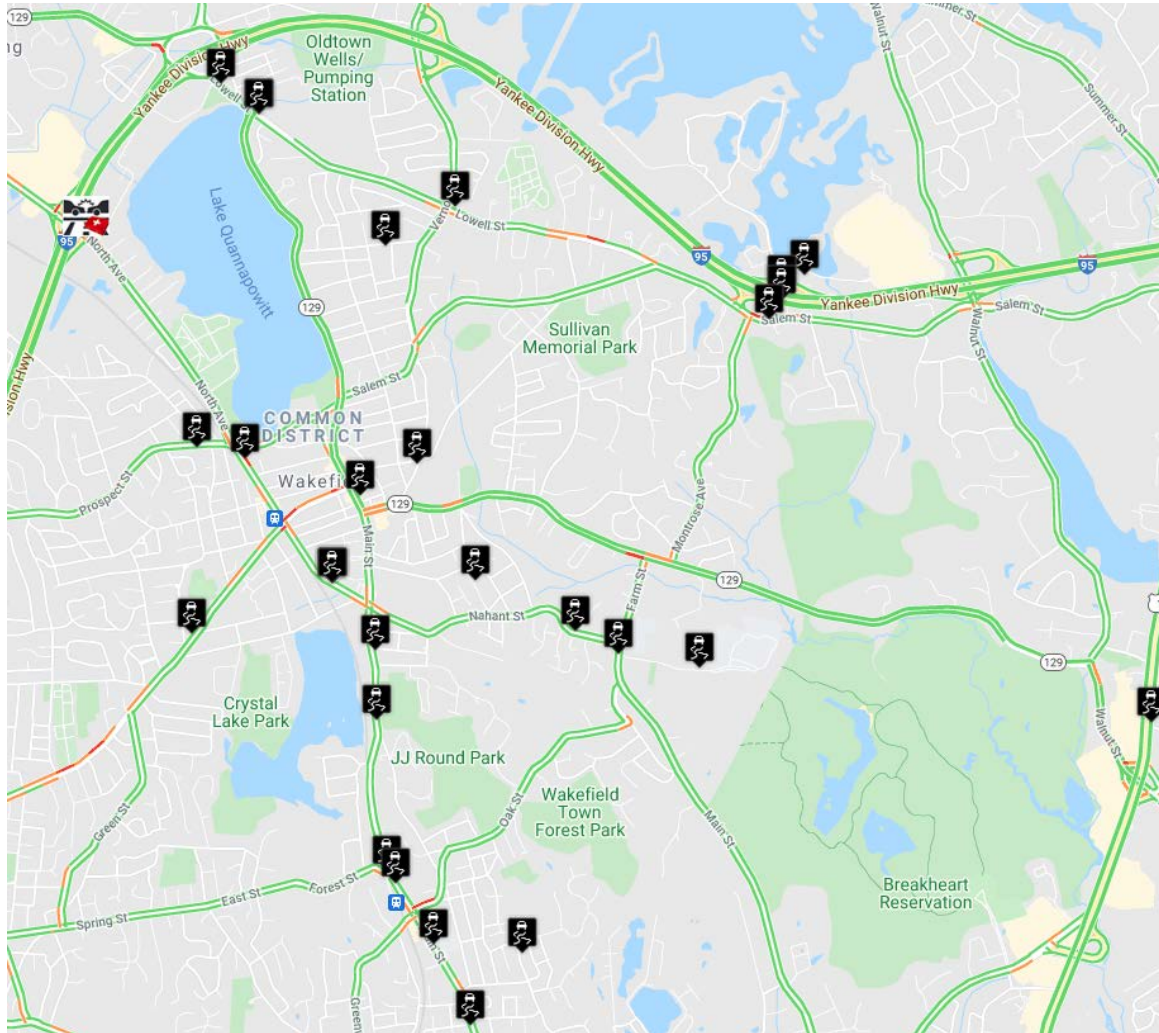


CRASH LOCATION GRAPH:
