Fiscal Year 2020 Finance Committee Recommendations

1) General Government

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the General Government Budget of \$2,423,672 with \$2,420,672 from Tax Levy and \$3000 from available funds seconded by Dennis Hogan and voted unanimously.

2) Protection of Persons & Property

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the Protection of Persons and Property Budget of \$12,111,297 with \$12,111,297 from Tax levy seconded by Gerard Leeman. Evan Kenney moved to amend the motion by reducing the personal services section of the budget by \$100,000 (effectively eliminating the Deputy Fire Chief Position), amended motion seconded by Doug Butler. Amended motion failed with Hogan, McCauley and Kenney in favor Sherman, Bertrand, McManama, Chines, Sullivan, Gilding, Cusack, Reilly, Butler, Digiambattista against; Leeman abstained.

Main Motion voted unanimously.

3) Human Services

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the Human Services budget of \$853,244 with \$853,244 from Tax levy seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

4) Department of Public Works

Joe Bertrand moved to recommend the Department of Public Works budget in the amount of \$6,858,201 with \$6,787,131 from Tax levy and \$71,070 from available funds seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted with Peter McManama in the negative.

5) Water and Sewer Enterprise

Joe Bertrand moved to recommend the Water and Sewer Enterprise Budget in the amount of \$14,217,415 with \$5,589,995 from Water Receipts and \$8,627,420 from Sewer Receipts seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

6) School Department

Joe Bertrand moved to recommend the School Department budget in the amount of \$42,046,048 with \$41,931,048 from Tax levy and \$155,000 from available funds seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted.

7) Library

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the Library budget of \$1,729,791 with \$1,687,835 from Tax levy and \$41,956 from available funds seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

8) Vocational School

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the Vocational School budget of \$1,441,735 with \$1,441,735 from Tax levy seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

9) Unclassified

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the unclassified budget of \$1,714,091 with \$1,714,091 from Tax levy seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

10) Benefits and Administration

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the Benefits and Administration budget of \$ 17,124,520 with \$17,124,520.00 from Tax levy seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.

11) WMGLD Benefit Expense

Joseph Bertrand moved to recommend the WMGLD Benefit expense transfer of \$2,078,784 with \$2,078,784 from the WMGLD accounts seconded by Dennis Hogan and so voted unanimously.
