LAWN CARE

- Limit your use of fertilizer.
- If you've tested your soil and need some extra nutrients for your plants or grass, opt for brands with low nitrogen and phosphorus.

CLEANING SUPPLIES

- Dispose of household hazardous materials properly.
- If you are unaware of how to properly dispose of old cleaning products, call the DPW or visit one of the Town's hazardous waste drop-off days.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Dispose of yard waste properly. Visit the DPW at Town Hall to purchase a permit to Wakefield's Nahant Street yard waste site.
- Use rain barrels to collect rain water than can be recycled for grass or garden watering.
- Dispose of pool chemicals properly. The Town co-hosts hazardous waste days with the Town of Reading twice a year.
